Slippery customers starting to wake up



As gardens cry out for a spring spruce-up, remember that those quiet corners of the yard might be home to some unwelcome residents. **Brown snakes** are common all across the state. **Death adders** live in coastal areas of Yorke Peninsula.

"Both of these species are venomous to various degrees and should be avoided" Dr Kelly, Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources Manager of Animal Welfare Manger said. "If a person or a pet is bitten by any sort of snake, seek medical attention immediately, even if you think it isn't venomous.

"Even when it is newly hatched and just 15cm long, a baby eastern brown snake has enough venom to hospitalise or even kill an adult. "Many bites happen when someone is trying to catch or kill a snake. If you see one in your home or business, watch where it goes, keep children and pets away and call a snake catcher to remove it.

"Most snakes aren't aggressive and they won't chase you. They are native animals with their own role to play in the ecosystem, such as helping to control rats and mice."

Dr Kelly said the best way to keep snakes away from the home was to keep yards tidy all year round.

Natural Solutions

Fly Repellant

- Burn eucalyptus, lemon or grapefruit oil in a vapouriser.
- Hang muslim bags filled with cloves or bunches of eucalyptus, bay leaf or mint leaves near windows and doors.
- Place a few spots of lavender inside lampshades so it can release its scent, when warmed by the heat of the lamp.
- Grow wormwood, pennyroyal, basil, tansy or rue near doorways – rub, pinch or bruise leaves to release the odours.

Gardening

- To stop snails from eating all of your plants, sprinkle crushed egg shells or kitty litter around plants.
- To stop garden tools rusting, rub the metal over with oil and then stand the blades in a bucket of sand. If tools are rusted soak in Methylated Spirits overnight. Remove and lubricate and they will be freed up and usable.
- Next time you go into your garden to pick some roses, take the potato peeler with you – the peeler makes it easy to remove the thorns.




A couple arrived at a car dealership to pick up their car after a service and found the mechanic working hard to open the car door as he had inadvertently locked the keys inside.
