Work on Historic Wall Area

Progresses

Having received a grant from the Natural Resources Management, Northern and Yorke CMC members and other volunteers have been working on a clean up of the area near the bird walk. Many man hours have been spent clearing weeds along the top of the historic stone wall and now comes the job of restoring the wall by retrieving the fallen stones from the mud and, under supervision of an expert, reinstating the stones into the wall.

White-Browed Woodswallow *Artamus*

A female white-browed Woodswallow. Males have darker, more striking plumage.



A common and regular spring and summer migrant. Arrives in mixed flocks with Masked Woodswallows, when their calls in flight attract attention. Both species breed in scrubs in close proximity to one another. They have a brush-tipped tongue but feeds almost exclusively on flying insects but also feed on the nectar in mallee blossoms.

The White-browed Woodswallow is a dark bird with a distinctive white eyebrow. The face and chin are black, the upperparts are deep blue grey and the lower breast to undertail is a rich chestnut brown. The underwings and undertail are pale whitish-grey, with white tail tips. Females are duller than males, with a browner body and pink to fawn underparts. Young birds are mainly brown, mottled and streaked buff to cream, and lack the white brow. This species is colonial and travels in large flocks that roost together in tight clusters.

History of the Fishing Industry at Port Wakefield and Gulf Waters

Part One

From: *A Welcome to Port Wakefield SA*

(date of publication unknown)

When white men first settled in Port Wakefield they found fish traps placed at various intervals along the mangroves. They were made by natives of the Kaurna tribe who came from the Clare district during winter months when the creeks and waterholes en route were full, as well as the two native wells in the neighbourhood of Port Arthur.

These traps were built of mallee and pine saplings obtained nearby, which were driven in to form a semi-circle with a curve at the seaward end, in order that all sorts of fish, crabs, etc. would be trapped when the tide receded and traps left high and dry.

By the fossilized remains found at the natives feasting grounds, large fish such as sharks and rays were also caught in these traps. Shellfish too, formed a major part of these feasts – oysters, razor fish and cockles as well as periwinkles and mussels, found among the mangroves both at Bald Hill and Port Arthur.

These fish traps gradually disappeared with the appearance of white men who removed the stakes that interfered with setting of their nets.


