

A call has gone out across Wakefield encouraging its brightest Vocational Education and Training (VET) students to nominate for the 2019 VET Student of the Year Awards, with cash prizes up for grabs thanks to major sponsor Balco Australia.

During the awards night each year, Wakefield Regional Council recognises local vocational students who have worked hard, made a strong commitment to their studies and who have gone above the requirements of their course.

Mayor Rodney Reid said Council was a keen supporter of local young people kick-starting their careers and investing in their future and these awards were one of the main ways Council fostered this. 




