AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS PORT WAKEFIELD 2019

Port Wakefield CMC is now calling for nominations for the Port Wakefield Citizen and Young Citizen of the year for 2019.

Eligibility Criteria

These awards are open to any person who has contributed in a significant way to the Port Wakefield community. The awards are open to:

- Residents of Port Wakefield who have made a particular effort during the preceding year for the benefit of Port Wakefield. Or have been involved in activities which have brought credit to the Port Wakefield area
- Non-residents who have been involved in voluntary community service or other activities directly benefiting the Port Wakefield community, environment, or bringing credit to Port Wakefield.

Award Categories

- Citizen of the year (Age 24 onwards)
- Young Citizen of the year Poss Kipling Award (Age: 12 to 24 years of age as at 26 January)

Name, contact details and signature of nominator is required for selection panel to gain additional information if required.

How to Nominate

Place this nomination form with attachment/s (if required) the locked box within the Port Wakefield Post Office by 4 pm / 16:00, Friday 10th January 2020.

Nomination Guidelines

- The contribution/service to the community by the nominee must be voluntary
- Any individual who has made a significant or noteworthy contribution to the Port Wakefield community during the preceding year and/or given outstanding service to the Port Wakefield community over a number of years shall be eligible.
- Only nominations submitted on this form will be accepted
- Nominations may be submitted by an individual or by an organisation
- Nominees must be Australian citizens
- Individuals only may be nominated
- Previous Award recipients are not eligible for nominations
- Persons cannot nominate themselves
- Additional and supporting documentation may be attached to this nomination form
- Nominations open from Friday 29 Nov 2019 until Friday 10 Jan 2020

Selection Considerations

When considering nominations, the Selection Panel may take into account:

- Achievements of the nominee in the year immediately prior to the awards, as well as service to the community in the years prior to the Award year
- Benefit or credit to the community as a result of the nominee's contribution
- Specific or overall/ongoing significant contribution to the community
- Broad community involvement
- Personal dedication and motivation in their volunteering

Our Turn to Speak is a national survey that seeks to understand the life experiences of people living with severe and complex mental health issues in Australia. This survey is being conducted by SANE Australia's Anne Deveson Research Centre (ADRC) in partnership with the Melbourne School of Psychological Sciences at the University of Melbourne, with the support of the Paul Ramsay Foundation.

We want to understand if and how mental health issues affect the way people are treated by others in areas like employment, housing and relationships. Survey findings will support SANE and its partners to advocate for the needs of people living with mental health issues.

Following a short screening process, participants will be asked to complete the survey. The survey will take about 30 minutes and can be completed online right now, or over the phone.

All responses will be kept confidential, and participants may be offered a \$25 electronic gift card as reimbursement for their time. Participants must be aged 18 years or over, and must have experienced severe and complex mental health issues in the last 12 months. Season's greetings to all who are reading the PW Community Newsletter. What has the Port Wakefield CMC worked at in 2019?

The question has been asked by a few within the community, therefore in summary:

- Development of a paved hard standing at Clementina / Brabham Corner
- Refurbishment of the PW
 Cemetery toilet (roof is coming)
- Installation of a picture rails within the Courthouse
- Clean up of the Men's Shed while improving their operating procedures
- Support to Wendy Garvie and her team with the SAPN pole murals
- Assistance to the PW Netball Club for fixtures within their new change rooms
- Working with WRC in the development of a Port Wakefield Strategic plan to complement the regional plan
- Attend regional forums lead by PIRSA, national parks, Adelaide International Bird Sanctuary
- Provision of endorsements for regional grants towards improving town security (CCTV)
- Rostering of the courthouse
- Lobby and assist WRC with data for the provision of a Childcare facility within PW
- Work with council in gaining works to be completed within PW as part of the Highway works.

There is more going on to develop the lagoon as a tourist park / rest point. Currently the area has many title holders and this will be worked through in time. We would like to thank local residents who have attended meetings and voiced their concerns on local issues, while we are able to assist with some issues unfortunately not all of them.

Double act:

WRC's two Citizens of the Year for 2020

We just couldn't choose! Wakefield Regional Council will present two Citizens of the Year 2020, along with a stellar Young Citizen and Event of the Year selection. Owen's Brian Parker and Blyth's Tracey Andriske are joint winners of the prestigious title, which Wakefield Mayor Rodney Reid says "is acknowledgement of their many years of community service."

On Australia Day, Council presents the winners of each category with an award to thank and recognise their hard work.

"Both Brian and Tracey have grand visions and a big heart that have helped bring about some well-known projects we see every day," Mayor Reid said. "It was just too difficult to choose because Council recognises them both as remarkable, irreplaceable people."

Brian, who 'epitomises community spirit' has volunteered his time to a long list of groups, including Owen CFS, Owen Swimming Pool, Adelaide Plains Male Voice Choir, Balaklava Rural Youth and all of the local sporting clubs.

Some projects he has played a strong role in include the Owen Wetlands, setting up the Owen Community Shed and spearheading the Owen Walking Track, which transformed a largely unvisited 'green belt' into a walker's paradise.

Brian was the driving force to bring the concept of a Men's Shed just after the devastating Pinery Fire – a very timely addition after such a traumatic event. He loves being in the shed and working with the members and this is a role he continues to play, as well as looking after the management and expansion of the shed.

Wakefield's other Citizen of the Year Tracey, also tirelessly works on projects to benefit the town and its people – most of them voluntarily; like grant writing and fundraising for a third court for the Blyth recreation grounds.

Another attribute to be admired of Tracey is her many roles around town. To name a few: she's a regular volunteer behind the Candy Bar at Blyth Cinema, an active member in the Trinity Blyth Lutheran Church and is part of the Blyth Progress Association, helping with events like busy bees, tree planting, Christmas carnivals, ANZAC Day and Australia Day.

Tracey takes care of administrative responsibilities at Blyth Netball Club and umpires on Saturdays, and she still holds the record for the most games played - 513 games! A cause close to her heart is raising money for cancer research. In 2010 she organised a 24 hour shearing challenge on Blyth Oval, which raised \$45,000. She has also organised a Relay for Life, five years running.






