## **Port Wakefield Courthouse Museum**



With the Christmas holiday period upon us, we would like to remind local people of the absolute 'gem' they have in the Port Wakefield Courthouse Museum, located in West Street. The museum is housed in the original courthouse, which is only metres from the old stone wharf.

Built to 'contain' the behaviour of unruly muleteers and 'locals' of the copper period, other early offenders were apprehended on arrival by boat, and often ordered by a magistrate to spend time in the cells adjoining the courthouse.

You are urged to support your local community and visit the museum, inspect the displays and maybe spend just a few minutes in a cell and the exercise yard, and reflect on what it would have been like to have been a prisoner in Port Wakefield in the 1800's.

from a book of the same name by Paul Taylor and Wikipedia

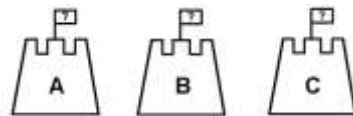
### Little Raven *Corvus mellori*



This common bird is known to everyone, but not usually by the right name. They are mistakenly, although understandably, called “crows”. Crows and ravens are similar in appearance. There are crows in Australia, but not in this area. The nearest crows to Port Wakefield are the Adelaide football team. Ravens are wily and intelligent. Adults have white eyes and young birds have brown. Little Ravens, like magpies, begin nesting early in June or July. *The collective noun for crows is a murder of crows. But a flock of ravens is called an unkindness.*

## **AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS PORT WAKEFIELD 2019**

Port Wakefield CMC is now calling for nominations for the Port Wakefield Citizen and Young Citizen of the year for 2019.

### **Eligibility Criteria**

These awards are open to any person who has contributed in a significant way to the Port Wakefield community. The awards are open to:

- Residents of Port Wakefield who have made a particular effort during the preceding year for the benefit of Port Wakefield. Or have been involved in activities which have brought credit to the Port Wakefield area
- Non-residents who have been involved in voluntary community service or other activities directly benefiting the Port Wakefield community, environment, or bringing credit to Port Wakefield.

### **Award Categories**

- Citizen of the year (Age 24 onwards)
- Young Citizen of the year – Poss Kipling Award (Age: 12 to 24 years of age as at 26 January)

Name, contact details and signature of nominator is required for selection panel to gain additional information if required.

### **How to Nominate**

Place this nomination form with attachment/s (if required) the locked box within the Port Wakefield Post Office by 4 pm / 16:00, Friday 10th January 2020.

### **Nomination Guidelines**

- The contribution/service to the community by the nominee must be voluntary
- Any individual who has made a significant or noteworthy contribution to the Port Wakefield community during the preceding year and/or given outstanding service to the Port Wakefield community over a number of years shall be eligible.
- Only nominations submitted on this form will be accepted
- Nominations may be submitted by an individual or by an organisation
- Nominees must be Australian citizens
- Individuals only may be nominated
- Previous Award recipients are not eligible for nominations
- Persons cannot nominate themselves
- Additional and supporting documentation may be attached to this nomination form
- Nominations open from Friday 29 Nov 2019 until Friday 10 Jan 2020

### **Selection Considerations**

When considering nominations, the Selection Panel may take into account:

- Achievements of the nominee in the year immediately prior to the awards, as well as service to the community in the years prior to the Award year
- Benefit or credit to the community as a result of the nominee's contribution
- Specific or overall/ongoing significant contribution to the community
- Broad community involvement
- Personal dedication and motivation in their volunteering

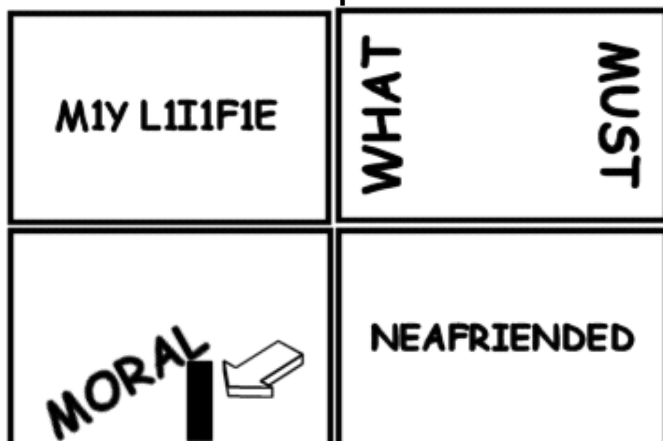

During the Newsletter Holiday break the Community Library will only be open on **Sundays from 12 noon to 1.30pm.**

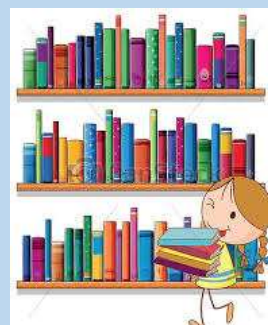

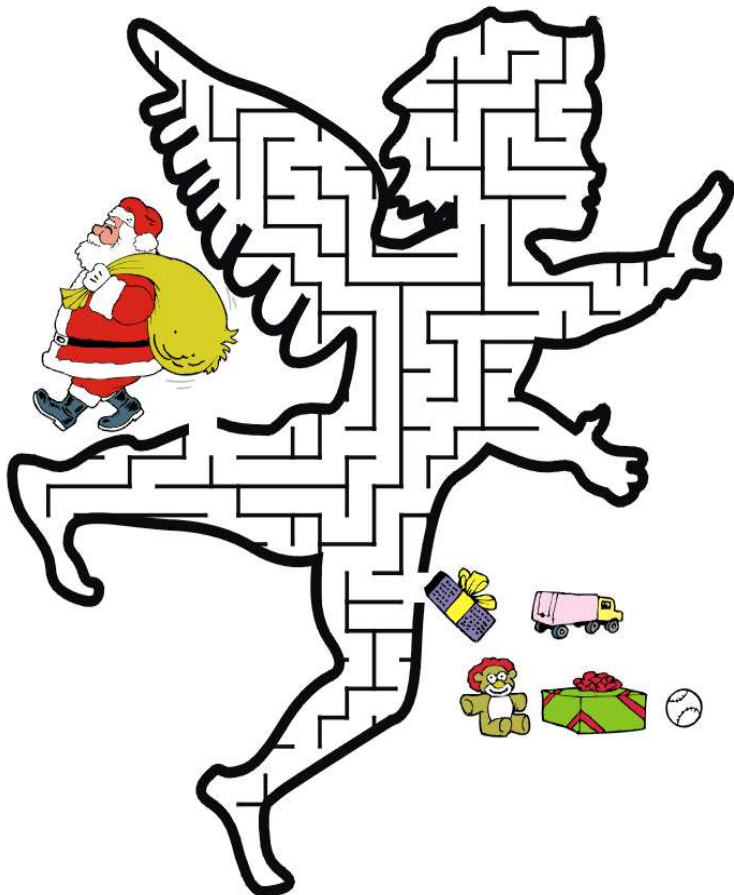

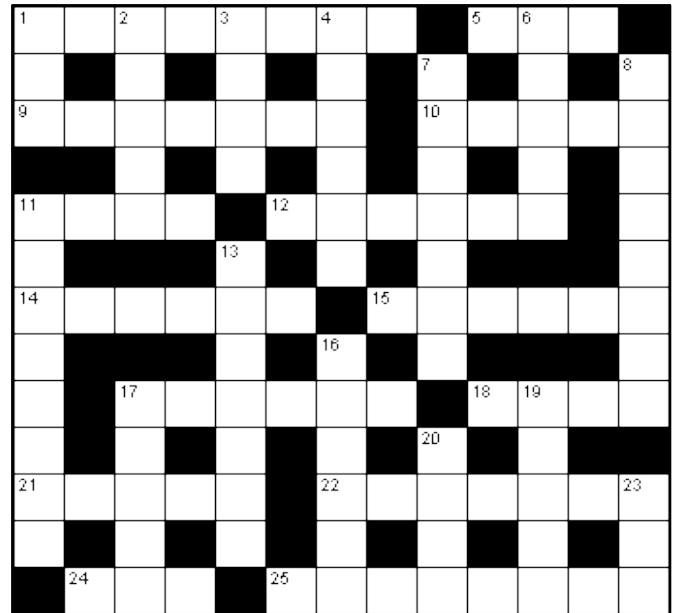
