When faced with challenges in the past we have pulled together, lending support to those doing it tough and showing that our community is our greatest asset.

The current situation with the COVID-19 virus is an emerging situation that will require a progressive and considered response from Government, Council and the community.

What is Council doing?

Council has a responsibility to support and protect our community and staff. We would like to assure you we are working to review our business continuity plans to ensure the continuation of core council services to the community in the event that the Wakefield area is impacted by COVID-19, and as with other Councils, we are following the expert advice. The Local Government Association (LGA) has set up a small working group involving councils; SA Health and the LGA Workers Compensation Scheme to determine a coordinated and collaborative approach should the situation with COVID-19 continue to escalate.

Some of the practical measures that we have implemented:

- Public toilet facilities are to be cleaned daily depending on availability of our cleaning contractors and our own staff.
- Council public forums will be cancelled or deferred with other means of communication with our community employed.
- The community bus service will continue to be monitored with regular communication with drivers and passengers. Cleaning and increased sanitisation practices have been put in place.
- Information regarding hand cleaning and symptoms associated with Coronavirus will be provided to staff and the community.

- Wash your hands regularly
- Use social distancing
- Look after each other

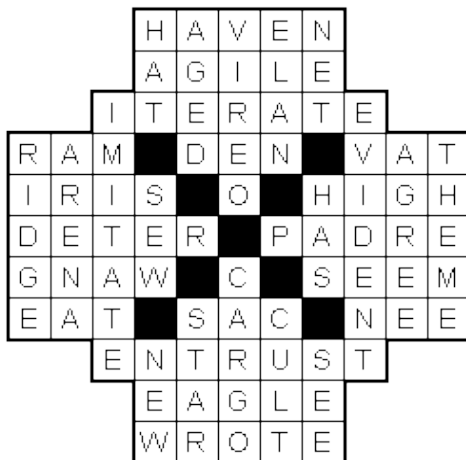

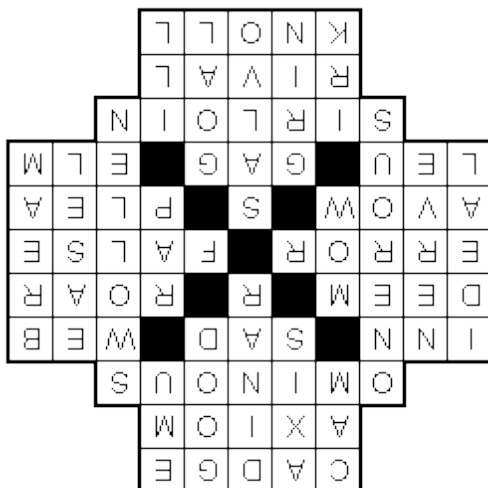

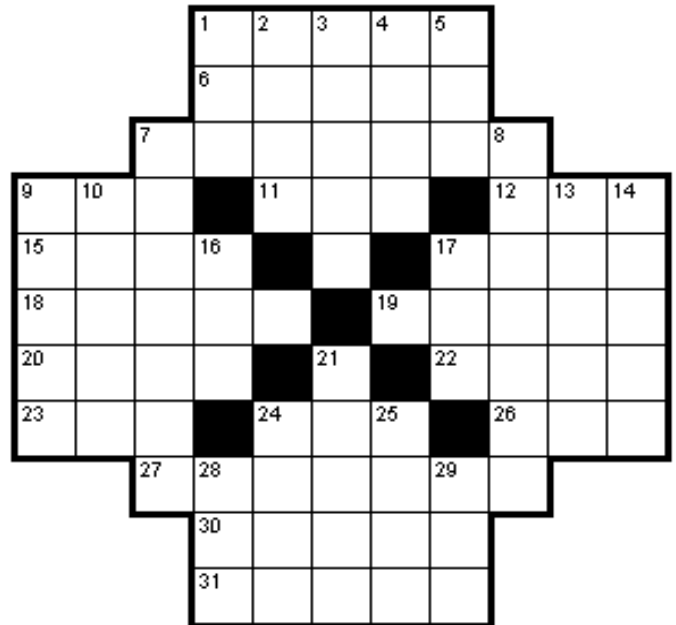
