

Mental health gap found in first round

Mental health services need to be improved in the Wakefield Council area, according to local health professionals.

The feedback emerged from a recent survey of health sector employees conducted by Wakefield Regional Council, which is using the data to form its new Local Health and Wellbeing Plan.

Following the health sector survey, WRC is now asking the wider community for its thoughts through a follow up questionnaire, available on council's website – wrc.sa.gov.au.

The public questionnaire will be used to gauge how people feel about the health and wellbeing offerings in Wakefield, and what barriers exist that prevent people from accessing these services.

The results from the survey will guide the development of the overall plan, which will highlight key actions for council to deliver over the next five years.

The survey is open until December 14, 2020.

Great Moments in Australian History

During World War One, Australia was divided by a bitter debate over whether to introduce conscription. A first plebiscite had been defeated, but Prime Minister Billy Hughes was determined to hold another one and get the "Yes" vote he wanted.

On November 29, 1917, Hughes arrived at Warwick train station in Queensland to give a speech on the subject. He was only halfway through when an egg came flying from the crowd, hit his top hat, and knocked it right off his head. An anti-conscription activist named "Paddy" Brosnan was responsible.

Hughes apparently reached for his revolver but had left it on the train that day, which spared Australians the awkwardness of their prime minister shooting a guy. Instead, he ordered local cop Sergeant Henry Kenny to arrest Brosnan. But Kenny refused. He'd sworn to enforce Queensland's laws, he explained, and someone egging the PM seemed like a Commonwealth problem to him. Brosnan walked away a free man.

Hughes was so upset by the incident that he created the Commonwealth Police, a new agency which became the Australian Federal Police of today. And that's how Australia got its national police force: A prime minister who really wanted to draft people, and a cop who decided it was okay to peg an egg at him in Queensland.

- Young Citizen of the year Poss Kipling Award (Age: 12 to 24 years of age as at 26 January)

How to Nominate

Place this nomination form with attachment/s (if required) in the locked box within the Port Wakefield Post Office by 4 pm / 16:00, Friday 8th January 2021.

Nomination Guidelines

- The contribution/service to the community by the nominee must be voluntary
- Any individual who has made a significant or noteworthy contribution to the Port Wakefield community during the preceding year and/or given outstanding service to the Port Wakefield community over a number of years shall be eligible.
- Only nominations submitted on this form will be accepted
- Nominations may be submitted by an individual or by an organisation
- Nominees must be Australian citizens
- Individuals only may be nominated
- Previous Award recipients are not eligible for nominations
- Persons cannot nominate themselves
- Additional and supporting documentation may be attached to this nomination form. (1 Page limit)
- Nominations open from Friday 27 Nov 2019 until Friday 8 Jan 2021

Selection Considerations

When considering nominations, the Selection Panel may take into account:

- Achievements of the nominee in the year immediately prior to the awards, as well as service to the community in the years prior to the Award year
- · Benefit or credit to the community as a result of the nominee's contribution
- Specific or overall/ongoing significant contribution to the community
- Broad community involvement
- Personal dedication and motivation in their volunteering






