

Port Wakefield Railway Station 1918 (The Gulf Road)

TRAMWAY TO RAILWAY


The tramway from Port Wakefield to Hoyleton was built to cater for the Auburn/Clare agricultural district and was the first agricultural line in the State.

The line opened on Jan 1, 1870. Carriages rolled down the slight decline from Hoyleton to Port Wakefield and were returned to Hoyleton, pulled by horse teams. The tramway was not a great success in the first year as there was a light harvest and facilities were primitive. The returns were so low in fact that two successive private lessees could not make a go of it. Eventually the government took over the tramway and made many renovations.

Many people in Port Wakefield were not happy with the railway as they felt it was the ruination of the town. In September, 1877 the government offered a £50 reward for information resulting in the apprehension and conviction of those people responsible for placing a fence post across the line 17 miles from Port Wakefield.

The railway line was for many years narrow gauge and was converted to broad gauge in the 1920's.

In the Garden 2021 no.1


A Happy 2021 Gardening New Year to All... Now we can look around admire our summer garden, taking stock as we do of the plants that have become scraggly and need tidying up...

OP SHOP THANKS




