

#### **PANCAKE DAY THANKS**

Port Wakefield Uniting Church celebrated Shrove Tuesday by cooking pancakes on February 16<sup>th</sup>. We are grateful to the Port Wakefield Primary School students and staff who each year support this fundraiser and delight in tasting our delicious wares. Thanks also to a lovely group of locals who came around for morning tea and a chat.

Many of the Port Wakefield businesses ordered pancakes which were delivered for morning tea. Approximately \$370 was raised on the day for UnitingCare organizations to help them provide practical support to South Australians in need – those without a home, people living with disabilities, vulnerable children and adults, older people and families in crisis.

Since its inception in 2002, more than one million pancakes have been sold and over \$600,000 has been raised by groups state-wide.

**Restless Flycatcher** *Myiagra inquieta*Another bush bird that has seriously declined in numbers.



It is a native of eastern and southern Australia. It is about 20 cm (8 in) long, with a glossy dark blue crest, a grey-blue back and white underparts. It is similar to the willie wagtail, though the lack of a black throat, white eyebrow and slenderer body shape are distinguishing features.

It feeds on insects, as well as other invertebrates such as spiders and centipedes and will feed alone or in pairs. It often hovers with its head and tail pointed downwards as it picks insects off from leaves. It's rarely goes to the ground, preferring to hunt insects from mid-canopy.

## **Great Moments in Australian History**

Convict life didn't get much more dismal than on Sarah Island, a penal station in Van Diemen's Land where prisoners passed the time between floggings and dysentery outbreaks by cutting timber for shipbuilding. In 1834, the authorities decided to close it down and relocate everyone to Port Arthur instead. But a convict named James Porter had a better idea.

Porter and nine other men were the last prisoners left on the island, and were supposed to finish building a brig called *The Frederick* that would transport them to Port Arthur. Instead, as soon as the ship was ready, the men overpowered their guards, swiped it, and set sail for the horizon. After six weeks at sea, they made it all the way to Chile, where they enjoyed two years of freedom. However, the governor eventually handed over Porter and three of his mates to the British Navy. In 1837, they were brought back to Hobart in chains and convicted of piracy.

It looked like the four men were headed for the gallows. Fortunately, Porter had an ingenious defence. *The Frederick*, he argued, hadn't been launched and registered at the time they stole it. It might have been "canvas, rope, boarding and trenails, put together shipwise," but legally, it didn't count as a ship yet. What's more, the non-ship was stolen in a harbour, and you had to be on the high seas to commit piracy. The authorities had to admit these were pretty good points. Thanks to Porter's pedantry, the four escaped the noose. Ten years later, he escaped captivity again and this time disappeared for good.

Dear Resident,

I am writing this letter to you and other town folk to raise the issue of declining volunteer numbers within Port Wakefield Country Fire Service (CFS) and the inability to attract new volunteers.

Firstly, I would like to point out that Port Wakefield (PW) CFS in recent years has always punched well above its weight compared to other towns with a greater population base. We have deployed our CFS Volunteer's and our PW appliances interstate to NSW, VIC and within the South Australian region - Clare Valley, Yorke Peninsula, Adelaide Hills, and Kangaroo Island just to name the most recent events. In a lot of cases these deployments were conducted multiple times over. As a result, a lot of the Port Wakefield CFS Volunteer's will be eligible for the "National Emergency Services Medal" which is quite exceptional. A few of the members have also received a Citation from the New South Wales Government. The NSW Premier's Bushfire Emergency Citation was awarded to recognize personnel who served in New South Wales during the 2019/2020 Fire Season. We as Port Wakefield residents should be very proud of what our local CFS has accomplished, especially with its limited membership numbers.

Apart from a horrendous fire season 2019-2020 then COVID19 our biggest threat at present is the lack of volunteers. Currently we have 15 Active members & two of those are operational support and if I break that down further nine of those are actually Port Wakefield residents. This doesn't seem like a lot given the 2016 census recorded Port Wakefield as having a population of 636 people. Just recently we have had our Hazmat response accreditation and capability removed as we simply do not have the numbers of trained volunteers to facilitate that kind of operation anymore. The CFS writing states you need minimum six persons trained in that area and we only have two with little hope of gaining extra qualified members. Similar story within the brigade in regards to "Operate Breathing Apparatus" and the "Road Crash Rescue" skill sets, we still hold those response types but we are at the minimum number of trained operators.

My question to the Port Wakefield residents is how do we fix this?

How do we regain the respect in the community whereby the residents are willing and able to volunteer their time for the benefit of the local community? We have utilized many forms of recruitment to attract new volunteer's, such as advertising, printing stories in the Plains Producer, letter drops, targeting specific individuals or head hunting. At present we are out of ideas and if we keep going in this current direction we will not have a CFS brigade or an operational one here in Port Wakefield. I sincerely hope it doesn't take a tragic event for everybody to sit up and take notice. Ultimately Port Wakefield CFS brigade is a community asset, if we ignore it and don't chip in we will lose it, and those resources will be redirected to other brigades that can respond to incidents like Balaklava and Dublin etc.

If you or anyone you may know of is willing and able to volunteer and help maintain this important capability for the township and its people please contact us via the CFS website https://cfs.sa.gov.au/volunteer/ or by walking into the Brigade located at 10a East Tce, Port Wakefield SA. We conduct training during the school terms on Monday nights from 18:00 - 20:30 (no scheduled training on public holidays). All that is required is a current police check (which the CFS facilitates and pays for) and be voted in by our members. If you have any questions please don't hesitate to contact me.



Incidents- In the last two weeks, Port Wakefield CFS has responded to a freight train fire and a rubbish/pile grass fire, and has assisted the South Australian Ambulance service with lifting patients.

**Training**- In February, your firefighters renewed their qualifications to use Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus, or SCBA. (Just like SCUBA, but without the Underwater bit.) This breathing equipment is necessary to protect them from toxic smoke while they fight structure fires.



On March 1, they helped water the local golf course as they practiced their hose skills for future grass fires.




"Ma'am," the officer replies, "you weren't speeding, but you should know that driving slower than the speed limit can also be a danger to other drivers."






