Silo art completion on the horizon

A new feature soon to be flying high over Owen is taking shape as paint hits the silos, with high hopes it will be completed by Anzac Day. After COVID-19 restrictions slowed down the original project timeline, experienced silo painter Cam Scales has been flat out on site – or in the sky on a cherry picker – to mark the town on the silo art trail.

Scales is bringing to life local artist Robert 'Alf' Hannaford's design 'Wheat Bags to Sand Bags', a tribute to the town's strong agricultural background, and its contribution during wartime. Mayor Rodney Reid said the Owen community had invested significant time, energy and fundraising efforts to bring the project to life.

"Given its location on the main road, this is sure to make an impact and create another reason for people to break up their drive and view the artwork," he said. Council was able to fund \$100,000 towards the project through the Federal Government's Drought Communities Programme.

The artwork will feature the transition of community life from pre-WWI to wartime, when locals moved their focus from filling wheat bags to filling sand bags instead. It will be a memorial to the brave men and women who served, and their loved ones left at home.

HAVE YOUR SAY ON THE DRAFT RECREATIONAL FISHING STRATEGY FOR SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

South Australia offers some incredible recreational fishing experiences, with an estimated 277,000 South Australian men, women and children participating in fishing each year.

To guide our recreational fishing future, we are developing a Recreational Fishing Strategy for South Australia. The draft strategy lays the foundations for a thriving recreational fishing sector, building stewardship, sustainability and security for the future of this much-loved part of our way of life.

It will give us the information we need to identify the interests, needs and priorities of the recreational fishing community and to address the key challenges facing recreational fishing over the three-year period from 2021 to 2024.

Your voice is important. Jump online, read the draft plan and let us know your thoughts.

The South Australian Recreational Fishing Survey is taking place from 2021-22 and by being involved you can play an important role in providing information to guide the sustainable management of our fisheries.

The Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA) is responsible for managing fish stocks in South Australian waters.

Understanding the number of fish harvested by all fishing sectors, including recreational fishers, is important to ensure the sustainable management of South Australia's fisheries.

PIRSA's research division, the South Australian Research and Development Institute (SARDI), will be working with the University of Tasmania to conduct a survey of recreational fishing activity in South Australia.

Fishing surveys are an established research method used worldwide to provide estimates of recreational fishing participation, catch and effort.

Survey approach

The Recreational Fishing Survey comprises a number of elements:

- telephone survey
- on-site sampling
- · survey on the SA Fishing app
- Goolwa Pipi survey

Telephone survey and on-site sampling

A phone survey commenced in February 2021 and will run until 28 February 2022. South Australians will be randomly selected to take part.

Volunteer fishers will be encouraged to keep a diary and share the information about their fishing experience through the year.

Throughout the survey, participants will be contacted by interviewers who will collect their fishing information over the phone.

Researchers will also visit key fishing sites throughout the study to measure the size of fish being caught.

The results of this study will allow us to estimate statewide participation, catch and effort levels across a range of species and will be used to manage the sustainability of our fisheries.

SA Fishing app

From March 2021, the SA Recreational Fishing Survey will be available for all recreational fishers through the free SA Fishing smartphone app.

Fishers are invited to participate by filling out the survey on the SA Fishing app whenever they go fishing.

Your participation in this survey will help us improve our understanding of how apps and new technology can be used as a tool for estimating recreational fishing catch and effort.

White-Winged Triller Lalage sueurii



A spring and summer migrant, usually in small numbers and occasionally numerous, but in some years absent.

The conspicuous male bird—black above and white below in breeding plumage—trills cheerfully through much of the day during the breeding season (mid-spring to early summer), frequently rising on fluttering wings in song flight.

The female is similarly patterned but in dull fawns and white. In the non-breeding season, male birds appear similar to the female, retaining blackish feathers only on the wings and tail.

Typically 16 to 18 cm long, white-winged trillers eat a variety of insects, which are taken on the ground, from in foliage, or in the air.


