



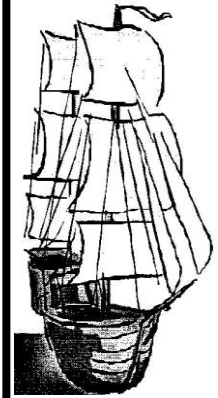

In the Garden 2021 No. 8

Autumn is a wonderful time to plant seeds or seedlings. Our climate is classed as Mediterranean. On the back of seed packets is a map of Australia and we are in the green zone, so you can always check when to plant.

Vegetables to plant now are Beetroot, Chinese Cabbage, Green Beans, Peas and English Spinach. Herbs are Garlic Bulbs, Marjoram and Oregano. Flowers are Cornflower, Calendula, Pansy, Cosmos, Daisy, Nasturtium, Primula, Sweet Pea, Antirrhinum, Viola and Poppy. Bulbs now are Dahlia and Gladioli. Those are a few suggestions to help you plan.

Have Your Say: Port Wakefield Masterplan survey

Are you ready to have a say on the Port Wakefield you would like to see? As part of Wakefield Regional Council's Port Wakefield Masterplan project, the community is being asked to confirm a 'vision' for the Port and design principles for the project as part of a new survey.

Wakefield Mayor Rodney Reid says this is the opportunity for anyone who lives, works or visits Port Wakefield to share their thoughts and ideas with the planners.

"Port Wakefield is one of our most significant tourism gateway and lifestyle destination opportunities, which is why the town's development forms a key part of our Wakefield 2030 Community Plan," Mayor Reid said. "Recasting Port Wakefield as the launch pad for great adventures and rejuvenating the streetscapes and foreshore of this historic seaside town are key aims of the masterplan."

"The town is rich in history of state significance, and nestled at the northern point of Gulf St Vincent, provides the perfect gateway to tourism regions. The masterplan will be the critical first step to opening up the town's tourist potential and enhancing Port Wakefield's features for current and future residents."

"We want to hear from as many people as we can so we can establish the community's views before starting to produce the masterplan document."

The survey - available on the Council's website wrc.sa.gov.au - follows consultation with key stakeholders in the past two months.

Community members have until 28 May to have a say.



Yesterday's News

A Port Wakefield Shark Story.

(South Australian Chronicle December 14 1889)

"At the time this happened I was captain of a brig trading on the Australian coast, and had just put into Port Wakefield. The long-boat was lowered and I took the tiller and directed my men to pull ashore. . . . No sooner had we left the ship than we were chased by the hugest monster in the shape of a shark I have ever seen. The brute made frequent attempts to get his head over the gunnel of the boat, but we succeeded in beating him off. This shark was not alone, but was followed by a lot of his friends and relatives. . . . When I told the superintendent what happened he exclaimed, 'Oh, that's Port Wakefield Tom. We are accustomed to him hereabouts.'

On hearing that this shark was looked upon with a tolerant, if not a kindly eye, I resolved to lay Port Wakefield under an obligation. I went to the blacksmith's shop and ordered a tremendous fish hook quite 9 inches long and strong enough to hold anything. When I got on board I got a new piece of 3 inch hawser and a couple of pounds of pork. Having made the book fast and attached the bait I threw it over the stern. . .

Looking out I saw the bait had done its work, and from the commotion in the water the visitor was evidently our big friend. I called all hands, and we hauled on him with might and main, but with no result . . . and then snap went the hawser, and away went Port Wakefield Tom like a torpedo. This 'sell' only made me more resolved. Next day I was ashore again and ordered another hook of slightly larger size, and a double one— that is, one with two hooks on one shank. We secured the hook this time with chain as well as hawser. . . . From where I sat watching the bales coming up and being lowered into the cargo boats, Port Wakefield harbor could be distinctly seen, and I watched the lighters as they came and went.

Several hours after setting my hook, and when the lighter alongside was ready to push off, I looked in vain for the empty one that was to take its place. There was no boat in sight, and, in the name of all that was wonderful, Port Wakefield had vanished! It flashed upon me that the vessel was wearing round, and suddenly I thought of Port Wakefield Tom. I ran astern, and sure enough there he was, hard and fast, and bearing us round. Now we were nine men all told on the brig . . . but we could not, with our united efforts, put that fish on board till we got a tackle on, and then Tom had to give in, and was gradually towed alongside. We had not much trouble in killing him, for we hauled him half out of the water.

Now comes the surprising part of my yarn. We found on opening him that he had got hold of an old curiosity shop, containing all sorts of queer tackle. Among other treasures he contained a bullock's horn, three seamen's knives, four watches, and a ship's chronometer!"

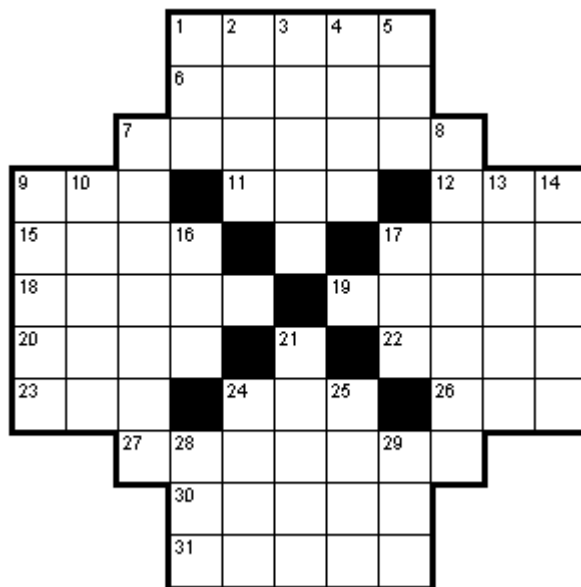

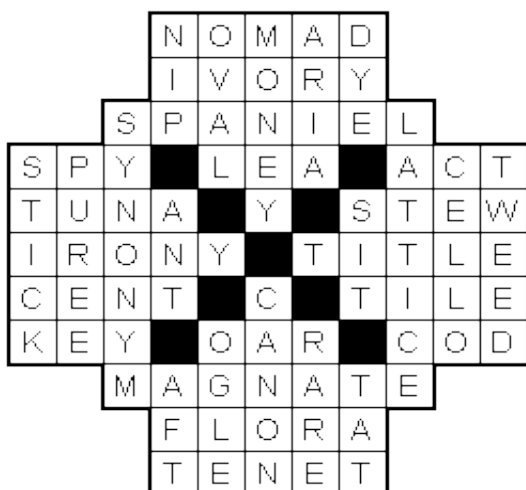
