From 6:00pm on July 20, the only reasons to leave home will be to care for someone, for essential work, to purchase essential goods such as food and medicine, for exercise with people from your household, and for healthcare — which includes COVID testing and vaccination.

Schools will be closed from July 21, elective surgery is on hold, and all construction work will be postponed. People need to stay in the house they had chosen to go to by 6:00pm on July 20. At this stage, lockdown is expected to last for seven days, but check www.sahealth.sa.gov.au for the latest details.


# In the Garden 2021 Vol 13

# **Birds of the Port Wakefield Area**

from a book of the same name by Paul Taylor and Wikipedia

Eastern Curlew
Numenious madagascariensis



Fairly Common. Appears to be decreasing in numbers.

A large shorebird most similar in appearance to the long-billed curlew, but slightly larger. It is mostly brown in colour, differentiated from other curlews by its plain, unpatterned brown underwing. It is not only the largest curlew but probably the world's largest sandpiper, at 60–66 cm in length and 110 cm across the wings.

The body is reportedly 565–1,150g, which may be equalled by the Eurasian curlew. The extremely long bill, at 12.8–20.1 cm in length, rivals the bill size of the closely related long-billed curlew as the longest bill for a sandpiper. In Australia, its status under the EPBC Act is Critically Endangered.



# **Port Wakefield**

(Yorke's Peninsula Advertiser July 21, 1885)

Bishop Kennion, of Adelaide, held a confirmation service in St Alban's Church on Thursday evening, when nine candidates presented themselves. The church was crowded. One or two gentlemen(?) (save the mark) disturbed the Bishop and those seated near them by carrying on a whispering conversation, till called to order by His Lordship, after which his impressive address was listened to with rapt attention.

- Mr. Haden is missed very much in the church, as organist, and leader of the choir. His well-trained singers were conspicuous by their absence from the choir to the detriment of the singing. Some people have an idea that noise is the only thing necessary in choir singing.
- Business is very dull, as it is everywhere, though there are evidences of life in the Port in the building trade. A new Wesleyan Chappel is fast approaching completion. A saddler's shop and machinist's establishment improve the appearance of Edward Street.
- The institute is well patronized, the library proving a great boon to many in this not very lively part of the world.
- Some of the leading spirits have roused themselves and succeeded in rousing others from their usually lethargic state sufficiently to get up a weekly dance, which promotes sociability and affords an opportunity for the young folks of both sexes to enjoy themselves in each other's company. I wish the promoters of it every success.
- Mr. Caseaden, who succeeded Mr Haden when he left for Kingston, has won golden opinions from all classes for kindness and attention in sickness.
- Our annual show is to be held early in September. The committee are working hard to ensure its success.
- We have had some very severe frosts which relaid the growth of the grass and wheat, more rain is wanted for the farmers. (https://trove.nla.gov.au/newspaper/article/216322451)
