



In the Garden 2021 no 22

It's nearly the festive season, so any jobs we need to do that are outstanding, we had best do them before the celebrations start.

If you planted cucumbers and they are looking a bit tatty, sow a couple more now and they will replace the older ones. Garlic can be harvested too if the tops are drying off. Hang them in bunches in a dry, airy area for around a month so they can cure before storing. All the little odd jobs we have promised ourselves we'd do, now we can.

To plant on the week-end in the Vegie patch is Broccoli, Dill, Ginger and Zucchini. If you're planting Flowers, you may like these: Dianthus, Gerbera, Portulaca, Phlox.

If you have not had a great deal of success planting seeds, perhaps they are planted too deeply. The rule of thumb is a seed should be planted no more than twice its own diameter beneath the soil. Happy Gardening!



Yesterday's News

(The Chronicle March 4, 1905)

PORT WAKEFIELD

February 21.— The Grant's Hill Methodist Sunday-school children and their parents held a very enjoyable picnic at the Port Arthur Beach on Monday. The party left Grant's Hill about 7.30 a.m. in charge of the superintendent (Mr. James Sampson), and the 14 miles was traversed in good time, the visitors being most fortunate in finding a good tide, which, with the pleasant day, helped to make the outing a success in every way. This port which is situated at the opposite side of the gulf to Port Wakefield, can boast of a splendid beach, on which the children engaged in the usual footraces and other games, and wound up with a good paddle in the briny.

February 23.— On Monday a strongly built man of robust appearance was arrested by the police for begging and resisting capture, nnd sentenced to 14 days' imprisonment at Wallaroo the following day.— At an early hour this morning a burglarious visit was paid to the residence of Mr. N. Nicholls in Edwardstreet, and from a safe under the back verandah some meat and butter was abstracted. Some cakes of soap and a couple of towels were also taken. No attempt was made to enter the house.







AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS PORT WAKEFIELD 2022

Port Wakefield CMC are now calling for nominations for the Port Wakefield Citizen and Young Citizen of the year for 2021.

Eligibility Criteria

These awards are open to any person who has contributed in a significant way to the Port Wakefield community. The awards are open to:

- Residents of Port Wakefield who have made a particular effort during the preceding year for the benefit of Port Wakefield. Or have been involved in activities which have brought credit to the Port Wakefield area
- Non-residents who have been involved in voluntary community service or other activities directly benefiting the Port Wakefield community, environment, or bringing credit to Port Wakefield.

Award Categories

- Citizen of the year (Age 24 onwards)
- Young Citizen of the year Poss Kipling Award (Age: 12 to 24 years of age as at 26 January)

Name, contact details and signature of nominator is required for selection panel to gain additional information if required.

How to Nominate

Place this nomination form with attachment/s (if required) in the box at the Port Wakefield Post Office or email to pwcmc@portwakefield.sa.au by 4 pm, Friday 7th January 2022.

Nomination Guidelines

- The contribution/service to the community by the nominee must be voluntary
- Any individual who has made a significant or noteworthy contribution to the Port Wakefield community during the preceding year and/or given outstanding service to the Port Wakefield community over a number of years shall be eligible.
- · Only nominations submitted on this form will be accepted
- Nominations may be submitted by an individual or by an organisation
- Nominees must be Australian citizens
- · Individuals only may be nominated
- Previous Award recipients are not eligible for nominations
- Persons cannot nominate themselves
- Additional and supporting documentation may be attached to this nomination form. (1 Page limit)
- Nominations open from Friday 30th Oct 2021 until Friday 7th Jan 2022

Selection Considerations

When considering nominations, the Selection Panel may take into account:

- Achievements of the nominee in the year immediately prior to the awards, as well as service to the community in the years prior to the Award year
- Benefit or credit to the community as a result of the nominee's contribution
- Specific or overall/ongoing significant contribution to the community
- Broad community involvement
- Personal dedication and motivation in their volunteering
