"Say it with Flowers" is a wonderful way to give someone a gift just to say, "I love you," "I am your friend," "Thinking of you," or any other reason you can think to bring pleasure to someone.

Watering the garden during the heat, the best choice is either early morning or later in the evening when the heat has gone from the day. If you have a plant that has drooped its leaves and flowers, it is telling you it needs water, so feel the soil. If it is hot and dry, water is needed. Should you have already watered and the plant is doing that, don't worry. Some plants do that in the heat to protect themselves.

Flowers to plant now are Lobelia, Virginian Stock, Sweet Alyssum, all good for borders or pots. Vegetables are Spinach, Chives and Tomato.

Yesterday's News



(South Australian Register January 4th 1868)

PORT WAKEFIELD- The Port now has attained such a position that the Christmas festive season has not been allowed to pass without its due observance. Christmas Day was passed in various ways as inclination inclined, but the chief amusement was reserved for New Year's Day. . . .

The day's sport commenced with The Sculling Match ; one mile ; prize 20s.

Woolnan, 1; Russell, 2. The two got well away together, but it was evident that Woolman had the advantage of the lighter boat. The same distance was maintained nearly throughout, and Woolman won by about four lengths ahead. . . .

Horizontal pole, extending over a waterhole, with a live pig in a basket at the end of the greasy pole. Value, 20s. Only one competitor named Peter Martin entered an appearance to try his luck, and after several duckings, he succeeded in grasping the basket, with which he swam ashore amidst much cheering.

For eating a plateful of hot boiled flour and water. Prize, 5s.

Four men entered for this, and created much merriment. The first man that finished his hot meal was Ashby, who gained the money. A wheelbarrow race blindfolded finished the morning sports.

After dinner the horse races took place in the immediate vicinity of the township. A large muster took place— much larger than has been assembled together for a long time past. The company was not confined to one sex alone, but several families were on the ground and remained until the sports were concluded, which were conducted in a very satisfactory manner. . . .

After the termination of the races the large company present wended their way back to the township, where a variety of games were going on, such as jumping, footracing, quoits, &c. Much interest was concentrated on a sailor named Martin ascending the greasy pole, which measured 42 feet from the ground. After a good deal of ingenuity in adjusting the ropes for his foothold he succeeded in springing to the top amidst much cheering.



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AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS PORT WAKEFIELD 2022

Port Wakefield CMC are now calling for nominations for the Port Wakefield Citizen and Young Citizen of the year for 2021.

Eligibility Criteria

These awards are open to any person who has contributed in a significant way to the Port Wakefield community. The awards are open to:

- Residents of Port Wakefield who have made a particular effort during the preceding year for the benefit of Port Wakefield. Or have been involved in activities which have brought credit to the Port Wakefield area
- Non-residents who have been involved in voluntary community service or other activities directly benefiting the Port Wakefield community, environment, or bringing credit to Port Wakefield.

Award Categories

- Citizen of the year (Age 24 onwards)
- Young Citizen of the year – Poss Kipling Award (Age: 12 to 24 years of age as at 26 January)

Name, contact details and signature of nominator is required for selection panel to gain additional information if required.

How to Nominate

Place this nomination form with attachment/s (if required) in the box at the Port Wakefield Post Office or email to pwcmc@portwakefield.sa.au by 4 pm, Friday 7th January 2022.

Nomination Guidelines

- The contribution/service to the community by the nominee must be voluntary
- Any individual who has made a significant or noteworthy contribution to the Port Wakefield community during the preceding year and/or given outstanding service to the Port Wakefield community over a number of years shall be eligible.
- Only nominations submitted on this form will be accepted
- Nominations may be submitted by an individual or by an organisation
- Nominees must be Australian citizens
- Individuals only may be nominated
- Previous Award recipients are not eligible for nominations
- Persons cannot nominate themselves
- Additional and supporting documentation may be attached to this nomination form. (1 Page limit)
- Nominations open from Friday 30th Oct 2021 until Friday 7th Jan 2022

Selection Considerations

When considering nominations, the Selection Panel may take into account:

- Achievements of the nominee in the year immediately prior to the awards, as well as service to the community in the years prior to the Award year
- Benefit or credit to the community as a result of the nominee's contribution
- Specific or overall/ongoing significant contribution to the community
- Broad community involvement
- Personal dedication and motivation in their volunteering
