Well, the cold is still about and making things just too chilly. The best we can do for our garden is to feed and water it. Plant seedlings if they are getting leggy, (but not if they're doing well in their current situation) and protect them from the frosts. This can be achieved by placing straw, paper scrunched up and lawn clippings around them. To stop the paper from blowing away, sprinkle on a little dirt to anchor it.

Have you ever thought of growing fruit trees in a tub? All types of citrus trees will grow happily in a tub. Lemons, Limes, Oranges, Tangerines, Mandarins, Kumquats. Place in a full sun position and feed bi -monthly.

Veggies to plant-- Squash, zucchini, lettuce, carrots, and pumpkin through to late spring. Flowers to plant-- Calendula, Candytuft, and Nigella.

Yesterday's News

The Central Advocate August 25th 1905

PORT WAKEFIELD- After a considerable spell we have again been visited by earthquakes. The first was heard by a few light sleepers about 3 a.m. this morning; this naturally kept them awake waiting for more, and their watchfulness was more than rewarded an hour later by a rather severe shock. This time it was felt by many more, and was for a time put down to several different causes.

One gentleman had been expecting one for several hours on account of the continual barking and howling of dogs; one canine in his anxiety and haste to get free from his master's homestead had chewed up half a panel of paling fence before he could be brought to desist. The owner of this animal, who was really expecting an earth shock or some calamity, was, however, sound asleep and missed the tremor when it arrived.

Another person hearing the rumbling put it down to a convoy of cats passing over the roof in a northerly direction, which allowed us to fix the passage as from south to north. Two occupants of another house, but sleeping in separate beds, were so shook up that before they knew where they were they found themselves trying to force an exit from the building through a 15-inch wall.

Things are much quieter now, and hopes are entertained that some time will pass before we are again so startled. Even the birds in the trees in the oval could be distinctly heard as they were startled from their resting places.



LET'S GLOW!

Natural Glass Cleaner...

Saturday is our chore day, as I'm sure it is for most people. I have a little system down for cleaning the bathrooms quickly. The last thing I do is clean the mirrors and windows. Once they are done, things feel the most clean. And the same goes for my kitchen. Polishing up the front of the oven and microwave helps give my kitchen that "just cleaned" feel.

White distilled vinegar is a great all-purpose cleaner around the home that is not only effective, but very safe. It's been used for a long time to clean glass. Adding rubbing alcohol gives it an extra boost.

We have been making our own lens cleaner for our eyeglasses for several years now, and rubbing alcohol is the main component. Using a combination of the vinegar and rubbing alcohol is pretty great alone, but sometimes there can be stubborn streaks left behind, particularly on mirrors. That's where the Cornstarch comes in.

It does take a little more elbow grease, but the results are amazing. I'm guessing it's something to do with the Cornstarch particles acting as a mild, gentle abrasive that helps in shining up the glass.

You need the following items:

- A spray bottle
- 2 tablespoons of rubbing alcohol
- 2 tablespoons of white vinegar
- 1 tablespoon of Cornstarch
- 1 ½ cups of water



How to make it:

1. Place everything into a spray bottle and shake well. Shake well before each application.

Notes: The solution does not last forever, so make it in small enough batches that you'll be able to use it before it goes "off." I keep the solution in a spray bottle and mix up smaller batches as needed. The cornstarch will settle at the bottom, so be sure to really shake things up before spraying. If the nozzle gets clogged, just run some warm water through it to clear it out.

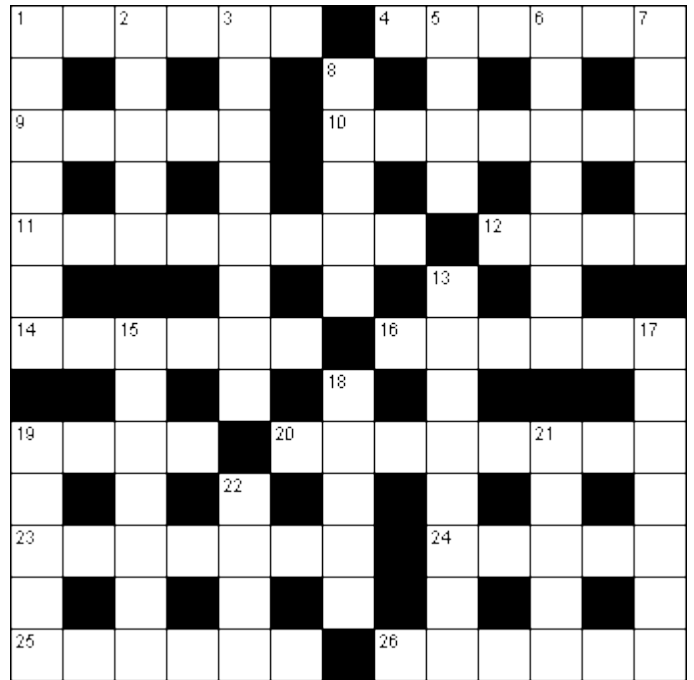
