## Port Wakefield Master Plan Concepts Released. Have Your Say!

As you know, Council has developed a master plan to unlock the tourism and lifestyle opportunities at Port Wakefield and promote the town as an attractive place for people to visit and enjoy. Council has earmarked \$1M in 2022/23 for this exciting project and we will be looking at a staged approach to the development over the coming years.

Significant work has occurred in the past year to engage a consultant, undertake site surveys and start developing concepts for community review. We are now seeking feedback on the concepts that include:

- Greening and beautification of Edward Street to encourage visitors to explore the town;
- Redevelopment of the tidal pool area into an enticing and attractive space with a playground, boardwalks and other attractions for families to enjoy, and;
- Landscaping and upgrade of the Port Wakefield caravan park to better connect the site to the community realm and create great connections along to the wharf.

The plans will also be available for viewing at the Rising Sun Hotel during opening hours from tomorrow to Tuesday 11 October and at Council's Balaklava offices until 10 October.

Alternatively, we are holding a number of drop-in sessions at the Soldiers Memorial Hall in Edward Street where you will be able to view the plans and provide verbal or written feedback:

- Saturday 24 September, 10am to 1pm
- Wednesday 28 September, 10am to 2pm
- Friday 30 September, 10am to 2pm
- Thursday 6 October, 2pm to 6pm

Consultation closes on Monday 17 October and we look forward to hearing your feedback before we progress to the detailed designs.

Port Wakefield Overpass and Highway Duplication Changed Traffic Arrangements – Port Wakefield Highway

The following changed traffic arrangements will be in place from 7am Wednesday, 7 September 2022:

#### Northbound:

- motorists travelling northbound through the township will be directed to continue onto the new northbound carriageway and newly constructed Wakefield River Bridge;
- the new northbound carriageway, north of the service stations, will be temporarily reduced to a single lane.

#### Southbound:

• motorists travelling southbound towards Port Wakefield will continue using the southbound carriageway that will be temporarily reduced to a single lane north of the service stations.

These traffic arrangements, as well as one lane in each direction through the Port Wakefield township, will continue until late September 2022, weather permitting.

#### **LET'S GLOW!**

#### How To Make Honey Vanilla Bubble Bath...

Everyone can agree that taking a bath is wonderful for both the body and the mind. While taking a shower might get the job done, a soak in the tub actually feels like a treat. And a bubble bath with a glass of your favourite wine? That is next-level awesomeness!

The kids love it, and you love it, so there's no reason why you shouldn't include a luxurious bath in your weekly/monthly/whenever-you-can routine. If you've been reading Let's Glow for a while, you might already know that I like to make my own stuff around the house - that includes bubbles! And I'm going to show you how to make your own Honey Vanilla bubbles!

I will be honest: My first attempt at concocting a bubble bath recipe a couple of years ago was a total bomb. The secret ingredient, it turns out, is egg white! It helps to create bigger bubbles (although they're still not huge) that last longer.

#### You'll Need:

- 1/2 cup light almond oil
- 1/4 cup honey
- 1/2 cup mild liquid hand or body soap (don't use castile soap!)
- 1 egg white
- 1 tablespoon vanilla extract

Combine all of the ingredients in a mixing bowl, and pour 1/4 to 1/2 cup under running water. You can keep any excess in the refrigerator for up to 3 days.

Give the water some splishing and splashing to activate the soapy-ness and take that nice, deep breath (followed by a hearty sip of wine). Time to do some relaxing!

#### A FUGITIVE PONY



Port Wakefield, September 20.

A nice little cream-colored horse, recently brought from the backwoods to learn town life, bolted today. It was attached to a spring-dray standing in front of a store, and two youths were busy unloading goods. The rattle of a chain frightened the animal, which made off at a terrific pace, one lad manfully hanging to the reins for some distance. The other youth chased the animal for a time, but was also beaten. The horse swung into Edward Street at express speed, narrowly missing a corner post and a perambulator, which was hurriedly lifted over a fence into an array of flower-pots.

Two men, noticing the runaway, made a dash to stop it, but came into collision in the centre of the street a few feet behind the fleeting vehicle. The rattle of their heads and their language put fresh life to the affrighted animal. A youth in a spring-dray gave chase, but, as his horse was not frightened, it could not keep pace with the runaway. A man with an armful of groceries, seeing the procession rapidly approaching, promptly set his wares in the middle of the street and dashed towards the runaway, but his rush shot wide of the mark. He turned in time to see a wheel strike his parcels, mixing up eggs, butter, and salt in an inextricable amalgam. A painter, who had just mounted a ladder, in his hurry to descend, brought the ladder with him, the paint pot hitting him with stunning effect on the head just as he was rolling out of harm's way.

After clearing the town the animal rapidly took the Nantawarra-road. A man leading a heavy horse dressed in a set of dray harness promptly cleared the steed for action, but, having too much way on when springing on its back, he landed on the opposite side on top of a barbed-wire fence, where some of his clothes still remain. The runaway was eventually captured about three miles out of Port Wakefield by a youth on a bicycle, who brought the horse and dray back, little the worse for the exciting experiences.






