Changed Traffic Arrangements - September 2022



#### Port Wakefield Overpass and Highway Duplication Changed Traffic Arrangements – Port Wakefield Highway

Port Wakefield Highway will be open to traffic in its upgraded configuration from 7am Friday, 30 September 2022, weather permitting. The following changed traffic arrangements will be in place:

#### Northbound:

- two lanes will be open to traffic travelling along Port Wakefield Highway towards Port Augusta and Yorke Peninsula;
- right turns into and out of North Street, John Street and White Street will not be permitted, with only left turns available; and
- a one-way service road to access businesses on the western side of Port Wakefield Highway will be open to traffic (see map attached).

#### Southbound:

• two lanes will be open to traffic travelling along Port Wakefield Highway towards Adelaide (see map attached).

Speed restrictions will be in place on the newly resurfaced sections of road, as time is required for the pavements to settle and grip to reach required levels.

Works on the Augusta Highway Duplication Project (Port Wakefield to Lochiel) continue, north from the new overpass. Please observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area. Signage will be in place to alert motorists to the changed traffic conditions.

#### LET'S GLOW!

#### How To Clean Your Stainless Steel Sink...

When we finished building our kitchen I was giddy about how everything turned out. Fast forward a week or two after actually using the kitchen, and it was clear I had screwed up one thing - our sink.

I've done the farmhouse sink before and didn't love it. So we went with a really basic two bowl stainless steel one. Big mistake. None of my pans fit in there! I can't soak anything! What was I thinking?!

Despite my sink remorse, I do still love to give it a deep clean. A dirty sink grosses me out! And it definitely needed one after I covered my whole kitchen in Kitchari. You know how turmeric stains your skin? Yeah, it stains sinks, too.

How To Clean Your Stainless Steel Sink...

#### Step 1 - Scrub with Baking Soda

Give your sink a good rinse with water and then sprinkle baking soda all over. Baking soda is perfect for scouring jobs because it gets the grime without scratching or damaging the surface. It's especially good for stainless steel sinks and porcelain.

Let the baking soda sit in your sink for at least 10 minutes (or overnight). Then use a soft sponge to give the whole sink a good scrub. Don't use steel wool or steel brushes that might scratch the surface and leave behind metal particles that can lead to rust.

#### Step 2 – Target stains with Cream of Tartar

Rinse out the baking soda. For stubborn sink stains, try cream of tartar. It's an acid cleaner with scouring power. Combine with a bit of hydrogen peroxide to make a paste and apply it to the stain. Let it sit for about 5 minutes then scrub and rinse off.

#### Step 3 - Condition with Olive Oil

Now that your sink is sparkling clean, pour a few drops of olive oil to a soft cloth to buff the sink and fixture. Apply going with the grain of your sink. This doesn't make my sink shine per se, but it does seem to help condition the sink and reduce scratching.

#### Step 4 - Maintain

To keep your sink in tip top shape, it's recommended that you wipe it dry after every use as sitting water can lead to water deposits. That's a little more OCD than I can handle, but you do you.

# Yesterday's News



The South Australian Advertiser 17/10/1882

PORT WAKEFIELD, October 16.

Trooper Dowling received information that some human remains were lying in the hundred of Balaklava. He left on Sunday and returned on Monday evening with the information that he had found the remains of evidently a very tall man in the scrub, also portions of a black coat and vest, pieces of heavy boots, a black silk handkerchief, teaspoon, spectacles, and two copper tokens (Holloway's and an ironmonger's at Geelong). It was evident from the bleached state of the bones that they had been lying there ten or fifteen years.

They were found by James Christensen whilst mullenising. It is a singular thing that our trooper goes away twenty-six miles when there is a trooper at Mallala, thirteen miles from where the remains were found.







#### LEGEND

Proposed Boardwalk link that touches the existing 1 mangroves and threads the foreshore to the Wharf in a seamless transition

#### Boardwalk Lookout

- Where the old boardwalk was located will be a new lookout to watch the King Tides permeate through the waterway
- Revitalised Shelter area Existing shelter to be upgraded with new furniture and paving

The existing Caravan Park will be revitalised with new understory planting, trees and lawned areas

Option to remove the existing boardwalk in the lagoon and create an island that activates the whole lagoon for recreation use

#### Wakefield Street

Wakefield Street will be transformed into a oneway street that prioritises pedestrian movement. A section of the caravan park will be relocated allowing the road to be re-opened, creating flow and access along the foreshore to the wharf area



#### LEGEND

1

The activated heart of Port Wakefield will include feature lighting, planted kerb build outs, feature paving on the road way and on the footpaths.

- 2 Retained Existing Trees
- (3) Main Trees (Feature) Each Intersection will be celebrated with a large Feature tree that will begin to create a rhythm, along the street.

Infill street tree and understory planting will be installed along the street to help soften, reduce the scale (pedestrian scale) and the Urban Heat Island Effect.

(5) Art Nodes

Each intersection will feature art work that tells the story of Port Wakefield

New Pram Ramps (6)

Where existing Pram Ramps are non-compliant these will be demolished and removed to become compliant pram ramps

New Paved Path to Foreshore 0

New paving will be installed from the Town Centre to the Foreshore

8 Feature Paved Threshold

New paving to the entry of Edward Street will provide a sense of arrival and bookend the revitalised streetscape

9 Feature Signage and Art Work

Entry Signage and Artwork will be strategically placed to provide maximum views to the Highway. This will ensure that all passers-by are intrigued to investigate whats down the main
