



LET'S GLOW!

DIY Face Masks For Acne...

Is there anything more annoying that an unexpected breakout? The good news is that homemade face masks for acne can be an effective and fairly simple way to treat all types of acne, whether it is an occasional stress breakout or a chronic issue. Plus, spot treating acne with a mask for the occasional pimple can reduce inflammation and kill bacteria without wreaking havoc on other areas of the face that may not be affected.

To save money you can make your own at-home masks with readily available ingredients at a fraction of the price.

Honey and Baking Soda Face Mask

Combine anti-inflammatory baking soda with exfoliating lemon juice and soothing honey for an easy, effective acne-fighting face mask.

Add 1 teaspoon of lemon juice, 1 tablespoon of organic raw honey, and 1 teaspoon of baking soda into a small bowl. Mix well and apply over the face and neck. Avoid the area near your eyes (lemon juice and honey will both sting). Don't turn this into a scrub by rubbing it into your skin. After 15 minutes, remove the mask with warm water, then rinse with cold water.

Due to the photosensitivity of the skin caused by lemon, apply this mask in the evening and always use a good sunscreen when going out the next day.

Avocado and Lemon Spot Treatment Mask

Mash one ripe avocado until smooth, stir in 1 tablespoon of organic raw honey, and squeeze the juice from half a lemon into the mixture. Mix together thoroughly, and apply the mask as a spot treatment or to larger acne-prone areas. If you have sensitive skin, use less lemon or skip it altogether. Leave the mask on for 5–10 minutes.

Raw Honey Spot Treatment Mask

One-ingredient treatments are our favourite! Honey has so many uses, and fighting acne is a powerful one. Just dab honey (Manuka is ideal) directly on the blemish to not only fight bacteria but also to calm inflammation and redness. Leave it on for 10–15 minutes, and then rinse with warm water.



Yesterday's News





PORT WAKEFIELD--The weather continues very cold and stormy here, keeping back the hay-making and barley harvest.

On Friday night last a valuable mare, belonging to Mr. Wm. Young, fell into the native well, two miles from this port, on the Government Beserve. Fortunately, the mare was got out again alive, and without much injury; but this could not have been done had it not been for Mr. John Daniel sending his crane on the ground as soon as possible, and soon after it was erected the mare was gently lifted out of the well. To prevent her from drowning, ropes were got around her to keep her above water. It is to be hoped that this accident will prevent a greater one. The well is in a most dangerous state. It is almost in the centre of the road from Adelaide to Kadina, in the middle or bed of the River Wakefield. It would be quite possible for a man to ride or walk into at night in going from Kadina to Adelaide, there being nothing to give notice that a well is there, the windlass and everything being carried away by the stream in the winter. It is to be hoped that something will be done to protect the water, and to save both man and beast from falling in.

Some persons on the same evening broke into Mr. Young's store at Port Wakefield- They managed to take out a pane of glass and get the doors open, and helped themselves to tea, sugar, tobacco, a keg of wine, and various other articles of many pounds value. It is very provoking that as yet the thieves are not found out, but we believe that Police-trooper Jones has done everything in his power to find out who the scoundrels are.




