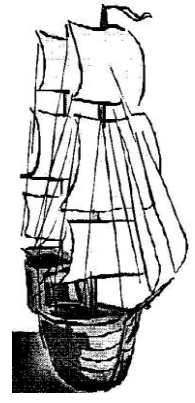

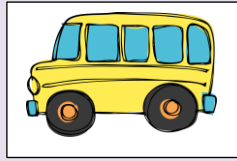

## **LET’S GLOW!**

### **Bye-Bye Chapped Lips – Ways To Keep Your Lips Soft and Smooth...**

Do you know that lips lack the oil glands necessary to keep their thin, delicate skin moisturised, which can quickly lead to dryness, cracks, and redness? Here’s a recipe for guidance, but precision isn’t necessary - you basically want equal parts liquid and sugar. Then use your fingertip to apply the mixture to your lips and gently scrub. Rinse with warm water when you’re done.

· 2 teaspoons sugar (you can use pretty much any sugar: raw sugar, brown sugar, regular sugar) · 1 teaspoon organic honey · 1 teaspoon almond oil

**Repair Overnight-**Follow up the exfoliation with a simple overnight lip repair mask. Once those dry, dead layers are gently exfoliated, your lips will be primed for maximum absorption of moisture. Wear coconut oil or the mixture below on your lips overnight and then wipe off any excess in the morning.

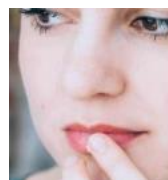
· 1 teaspoon vitamin E oil (about 3 vitamin E capsules) · 1 teaspoon honey

**Apply Lip Balm-**Regularly apply a ‘clean’ lip balm - that is one that contains natural oils such as coconut, avocado, jojoba etc or ones that contain Vitamin E, Zinc Oxide and/or Hyaluronic acid.

**Soothe Cracks With Vitamin E Oil-**If your lips are starting to get cracked and painful, open up a vitamin E capsule and put a little of the gel right on the problem spots (this works well for the corners of your mouth, too). Layer it over lip balm or coconut oil to heal overnight. P.S. Now that you have the perfect pout, try cinnamon to give you plumper lips the natural way!

## Yesterday's News

*The Areas' Express* November 8, 1918.



PORT WAKEFIELD- Last week will long be remembered for wind, dust, and no rain of any consequence. Crops have suffered and many gardens have been wiped out. In some instances vegetables have been buried beyond recovery, but hopes are entertained that some of them will be resurrected by next season. The Bundaleer water has proved destructive to vegetation where applied ; plants after a shower and followed by a good north wind are past recovery.

The crab season is now well on. Thousands are being daily captured, and are the staple food of many of the juvenile fraternity, who are so anxious for them that they cannot wait until reaching heme, but boil them in salt water, which, by the way, is supposed to be the proper cooking method, and then gorge themselves, and after a spell a few more are caught and carried to " the old folks at home." '

The snake season has opened well and promises to be a record one. Several reptiles have been killed, and in some instances reached great lengths. The largest, however, are those that get away after a severe battle. A swagman, who had camped in some bushes, relates that after tramping all day, and when spreading his blankets in the evening, found he had been carrying five feet of snake for nearly twelve hours. The reptile escaped, but followed him for miles the next day, in hopes, no doubt, of another free ride.

One venomous reptile, which had been noticed following hens about for a couple of days, when destroyed was found to contain several full-grown eggs as well as an assortment of mice. Along the railway line the corpses of many are to be seen mangled by the train. These reptiles are of an inquisitive turn of mind and usually poke their heads up to see what the noise is as the train is coming, and usually find out to their cost. Many tales are told by the linesmen of their adventures with these during the warm weather. A couple of sturdy snakes have been known to hold up a gang of men.

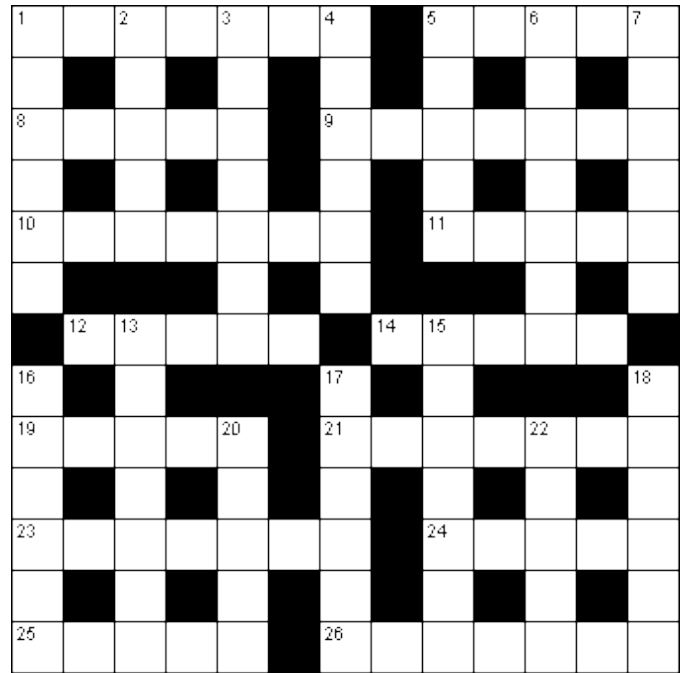

- Only nominations submitted on this form will be accepted
- Nominations may be submitted by an individual or by an organisation
- Nominees must be Australian citizens
- Individuals only may be nominated
- Previous Award recipients are not eligible for nominations
- Persons cannot nominate themselves
- Additional and supporting documentation may be attached to this nomination form. (1 Page limit)
- Nominations open from Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September 2022 until Friday 25<sup>th</sup> November 2022

### Selection Considerations

When considering nominations, the Selection Panel may consider:

- Achievements of the nominee in the year immediately prior to the awards, as well as service to the community in the years prior to the Award year
- Benefit or credit to the community because of the nominee's contribution
- Specific or overall/ongoing significant contribution to the community
- Broad community involvement
- Personal dedication and motivation in their volunteering
