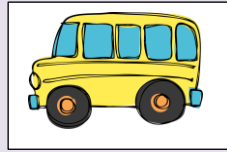

Farm Fire Unit Registration

To help better support Farm Fire Units (FFU) owners, the CFS is developing a state wide program to register units and provide them with consistent support and resources.

All FFU registrations (and stickers) expired at the end of the last fire season. FFU owners will need to complete an online registration to receive an updated FFU registration sticker. The registration is now for 3 years and is due to expire at the end of the 2024/25 fire season.

A sticker provided to FFUs who register online will identify you to CFS crews on the fire ground. It will also help you in accessing the fire ground at SAPOL Traffic Management Points* (TMPs or 'road closures').

Registering your FFU has many benefits, including access to:

- CFS resources and information
- Vehicle stickers identifying you to SAPOL at Traffic Management Points
- Insurance coverage for owner/operators and their equipment used in support of CFS during fires
- Fire ground safety awareness materials and online resources
- Easier access to logistics support during fires, including meals and water re-supply.

Your registration will also help CFS contact you with information about the ongoing improvements being made to supporting FFUs.

LET'S GLOW!

Yesterday's News



Yorke's Peninsula Advertiser December 24, 1877

PORT WAKEFIELD -- Christmas is drawing near, so we are beginning to feel festive, though there is nothing very exciting on the programme for the holidays. The Friendly Societies hold their annual picnic on New Year's Day, which is to be followed in the evening by an entertainment and a ball. Every effort is being made to insure a successful and pleasant day, and a large gathering is anticipated.

Contributions have been kindly given by most of the inhabitants of this Port towards putting a railing round the graves of the nine men who were drowned by the upsetting of the steamer Wakefield's boat. The survivors met with great kindness during their stay in this place, whilst the enquiry was being held. Most of them have already left the works: they could not stand the heat; so they have gone to seek a cooler region.

To show the strange ideas people form of this country, these men wished the police to watch the bodies of their unfortunate comrades as they understood the people were cannibals! — a decidedly new character for Port Wakefieldites.

There is to be a lecture given on Thursday night in aid of the harmonium fund in the Wesleyan Chapel ; but I hardly think it will attract a large audience. The subject is scarcely an interesting one to the majority of folks. " The Life and Times of Wyckliffe." Lectures don't "take" in Port Wakefield.

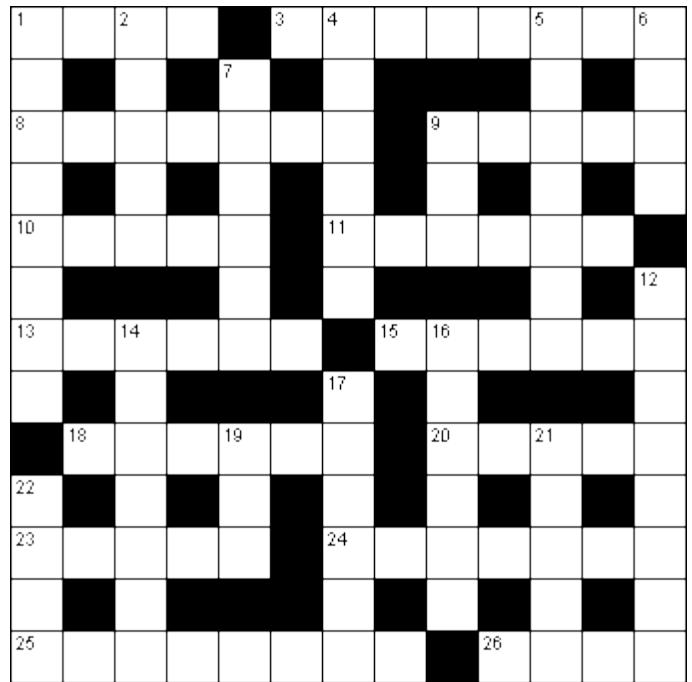
