Port Wakefield CFS Year in Review

We had a slow start to the year with COVID-19 restrictions in place, before finally resuming normal training in late March. We have put a lot of time and effort into training our members in various firefighting skill sets. For the first time in many years, we conducted a Regional course here in Port Wakefield (Defensive Fire Suppression) which the majority of our members participated in. Most of our members now have 2 to 3 major firefighting skill competencies under their belt and are more confident and competent firefighters.

We held our bi-yearly elections this year, and in a first for the Port Wakefield Brigade, we elected a female Lieutenant 1, Kathie Callaghan. We're proud that our female membership continues to grow, with eight women now active members of the brigade.

Our cadet program continues to go from strength to strength, thanks to the outstanding work of cadet leaders Sarah Rapko and Brett Dodd and the support of the entire brigade. Currently we have 15 cadets and there are more kids waiting to join.

The local council has kindly started to poison the weeds around our station, which has been a welcome relief, and we have had the large gums in our car park pruned back. We secured funding from Region to have the station painted internally, and our rear outdoor lean-to has been converted into a Breathing Apparatus Cylinder refilling station. Our Road Crash Rescue truck also underwent a major overhaul which included new in-cab safety features and in-cab pump operations. Unfortunately, our service provider tried to reverse it into the station with the light mast extended. We should see a replacement light mast in the coming months.

We also farewelled Phil Kevern, Ryan Sulcas, Daniel Falkstrom and Darryl Pain, all of whom will be greatly missed. We greatly appreciated their time with us.

The team's deployment of their hoses, connection of the branch (nozzle), and then skill of getting the ball around the "field" was impressive.



The cadets had their last training for the term on the 12th of December which was a team building exercise.

The cadets will restart their training on the 30th of January 2023.

Coconut Oil – The Miracle Oil – Part 2

Beauty Uses For Coconut Oil- Coconut oil is one of the most versatile natural beauty products. The scent is relaxing like a day at the beach, and the healing properties of coconut oil soothe and repair skin. Its abundant natural fats moisturize, while the lauric acid it contains protects and softens skin. It's also an antiseptic and helps maintain a healthy pH level in the skin. I find myself dipping into the coconut oil jar for everything from dry hands to straightening iron burns.

Whipped Body Lotion- Slather coconut oil all over your body (including your face - don't be shy!) right after your shower. It is best absorbed if the skin is still slightly wet. I keep the jar on the bathroom counter, so the heat from the shower helps soften and melt the oil.

Okay, yes, you can just dip your hand in the coconut oil jar. But if that's not appealing, try whipping it. Whipped coconut oil alone or combined with shea butter creates such a luxurious buttery texture. It's great for improving the tone and texture of skin bums like stretch marks and scars.

—1/2 cup shea butter —1/4 coconut oil

1. Using a double boiler over low heat, melt the shea butter and coconut oil together.
2. Refrigerate the mixture for about an hour to cool.
3. Beat the ingredients with a hand mixer for 5–7 minutes or until the mixture becomes fluffy.
4. Use a rubber spatula to scrape down the sides of the bowl as needed.
5. Transfer the body butter to a glass container with a lid. Should last at least 6 months.

Softening Detox Bath- Add a big scoop of coconut oil with about two cups of Epsom salt to create a warm detox bath. It's like using a moisturizing body wash - the oil coats and hydrates your skin. This counters the drying effect of soaking in hot, salty water nicely. You can apply more oil when you get out and go to bed, all warm and moisturised.

Shaving Cream- Rub coconut oil (by itself or combined with aloe vera) on your legs in the shower for an antibacterial shaving cream that helps prevent nicks and razor burn. You'll be shocked at how soft your legs feel - they'll be moisturised, silky, and gorgeous for days!

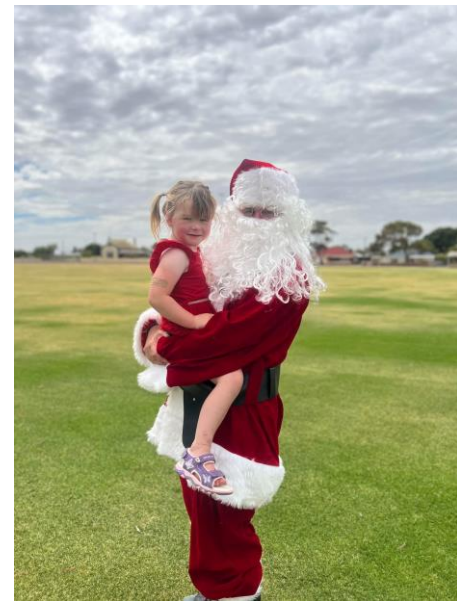

Farm Fire Unit Registration

To help better support Farm Fire Units (FFU) owners, the CFS is developing a state wide program to register units and provide them with consistent support and resources.

All FFU registrations (and stickers) expired at the end of the last fire season. FFU owners will need to complete an online registration to receive an updated FFU registration sticker. The registration is now for 3 years and is due to expire at the end of the 2024/25 fire season.

A sticker provided to FFUs who register online will identify you to CFS crews on the fire ground. It will also help you in accessing the fire ground at SAPOL Traffic Management Points* (TMPs or 'road closures').

Registering your FFU has many benefits, including access to:

- CFS resources and information
- Vehicle stickers identifying you to SAPOL at Traffic Management Points
- Insurance coverage for owner/operators and their equipment used in support of CFS during fires
- Fire ground safety awareness materials and online resources
- Easier access to logistics support during fires, including meals and water re-supply.

Your registration will also help CFS contact you with information about the ongoing improvements being made to supporting FFUs.

PORT WAKEFIELD, Dec.26th

Morrell, while on his way to a farm at Gulnare, was thrown from his motor-bicycle, receiving serious injuries to his arm and shoulder blade. On Christmas Day, Mr T. Bampton was thrown from his tricycle, breaking the thigh bone and doing other serious injuries. Both sufferers are under the care of Dr. Gribble.

Saturday was observed as Christmas Eve, the streets and places of business being decorated for the occasion. Orderly crowds paraded the streets until a late hour. Through some misunderstanding with the engineer, the electric plant was out of working order, the town being in darkness most of the time. On Sunday night, the Christmas waits traversed the principal streets, rendering various selections of a Christmas nature. Owing to no publicity being given, the majority of the inhabitants were in the land of slumber. 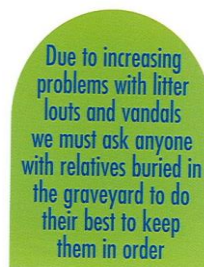

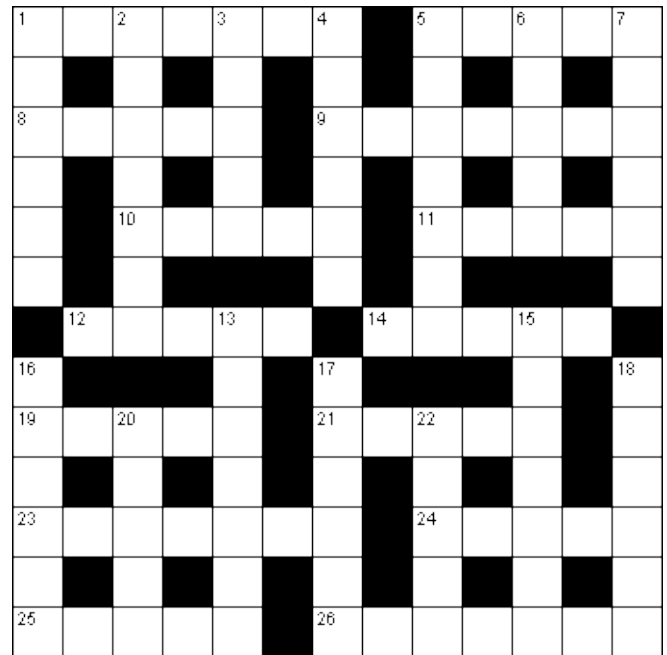
