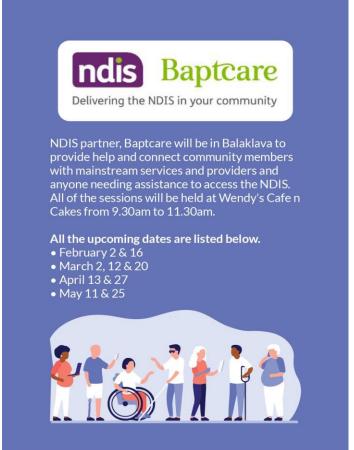

In the Garden

We've had a few hot days lately and our potted plants may have become hydrophobic. This is when the water drains straight through the potting mix because it has dried out.

I found a good tip from Bunnings to restore plants like this:

Place the pot in a bucket of water and let it soak for a couple of hours. This will rehydrate both the soil and plant roots.

If you're planning on planting some vegetables you could include leeks, cabbage, silverbeet, lettuce, sweet corn, cauliflower, broccoli, eggplant, and tomatoes.

If you're thinking flowers, then alyssum, antirrhinum, aster, begonia, carnation, cornflower, cosmos, dahlia, daisies, dianthus, foxglove, tanzania, impatiens, marigold, petunia, salvia, and zinnia should grow well.

Running out of ways to eat your bountiful tomato crop? Make a batch of tomato relish and enjoy it all year round!



Classic Tomato Relish

- -1.5kg tomatoes -500g onions
- -2 tablespoons salt -2 cups brown vinegar
- 1 tablespoon curry powder 2 cups sugar
- -1 tablespoon mustard powder 1/4 teaspoon pepper
 - Extra 2 tablespoons vinegar 2 cups of sugar
 - 1- Slice tomato and onion, sprinkle with salt in a big bowl, and leave in the fridge overnight.
 - 2- Drain off the liquid, mix tomato and onion with the vinegar in a large pan and boil for 5 minutes.
 - 3- Blend curry, mustard, and pepper with the extra 2tbsp of vinegar and add to the pan. Simmer for 45 minutes, then add the sugar and simmer for another 45 minutes, or until nice and thick.
 - 4- Bottle and seal in hot, sterilised jars while relish is still hot. Store in a cool, dark place. Refrigerate once opened.

Port Wakefield Overpass and Highway Duplication Opened

The Port Wakefield Overpass and Highway Duplication projects have been officially opened. The \$124.5 million of works completed include:

- Two lanes in each direction through Port Wakefield, with allowance for safe U-turns
- A new two-lane overpass for traffic travelling southbound from the Copper Coast Highway to Port Wakefield, and for traffic travelling along the Augusta Highway to the Copper Coast Highway
- The removal of hazardous turns at the intersection of the Port Wakefield, Copper Coast and Augusta highways
- Improved pedestrian access and landscaping in Port Wakefield
- Realignment of the Balaklava Road intersection to allow for safer turns.
- New bridges over the Wakefield River

On Saturday January 21, the Port Wakefield to Port Augusta Alliance held a community celebration day at Port Wakefield Oval to mark the occasion, and hundreds of locals turned out to enjoy a sunny afternoon of music, free food, and games. Minister for Roads Geoff Brock, Mayor Rodney Reid, and MPs Fraser Ellis and Rowan Ramsay all attended the festivities.

Beauty Uses For Coconut Oil

Coconut oil won't work for every ailment - or every skin type (especially if you're acne-prone, since it's known to clog the pores). Instead, these are the natural, DIY coconut oil tricks that doctors actually recommend.

Conditioning Hair Mask

Implementing coconut oil into your normal hair care routine may also be helpful for the treatment of dry, itchy scalp. When using coconut oil for dry scalp, gently massage the coconut oil on the scalp directly (think of it as a scalp medicine rather than for the hair). Typically, we recommend applying a thin layer or pea-sized amount of coconut oil after you shower and resume your normal hair care routine.

To treat dry, frizzy, or brittle hair, start massaging the coconut oil into the hair closer to the ends and away from the roots for a helpful trick to avoid a greasy scalp at bedtime. You can also use coconut oil as a hair "mask." In the morning, you will be pleased to wake up to smooth, shiny hair.

Body Scrub

Combine 1/2 cup coconut oil and 1/2 cup coffee grounds and firmly massage into your thighs and booty to increase circulation and reduce the appearance of cellulite.

Lip Scrub and Lip Gloss

Mix a tablespoon of coconut oil with a teaspoon of sugar for a quick, easy, and edible lip scrub. Apply a small, dimesized amount of coconut oil to dry lips for quick shine.

Cuticle Oil

Use coconut oil to soften your hands and rough feet.

Massage it into nail beds for a simple cuticle cream that also helps improve nail strength. Rub on your hands for a natural moisturizer that helps reduce fine lines and age spots.

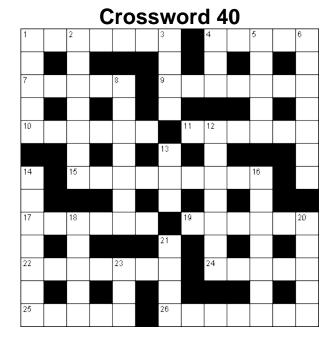

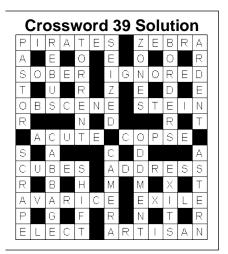
