Applicants must demonstrate alignment with at least one of the three themes of Wakefield 2030:

- Liveable Communities activities that enhance the quality of life for our community.
- Thriving Region activities that encourage economic growth and development.

• Sustainable Future – activities that support sustainability in the use of waste, water, and energy, or promote and enhance the environment.

Minor Community Grants of up to \$2,000 and Major Grants of \$2,001 to \$25,000 are available for community groups, while Minor Event Sponsorships of up to \$500 and Major Sponsorships of up to \$2,000 are available for local community events.

In the Garden

Citrus, avocado, and olive trees can be planted out now, until June.

If you're planting citrus, to give them a really good start, dig a hole at least two or three times the size of the pot they're in.

Dig in some Fruit, Citrus and Rose special mix. There are a few good brands out there to choose from.

Plant your tree straight into the hole. Because citrus like well-drained soil, it's quite beneficial to mound up the soil before planting.

A full sun site is best for your tree, but down to 50% sun can still be viable if you don't have a sunnier spot.

Also, it's recommended that your citrus tree have wind protection as this will help to protect your tree from the cold.

Growing your citrus tree in a very large container is also an appealing option.

They are beautiful, fragrant, and fruitful as well.

SOLDIERS FAREWELLED ENTHUSIASM AT PORT WAKEFIELD

A farewell banquet was tendered Lieutenant E. G. C Stopp, Sergeant C.G. Nicholls, Bugler O.G Witcombe, Privates C.H. Strawhen and T.W. Bowers, who are leaving with the expeditionary force from South Australia. The Foresters' Hall was gaily bedecked with flags and bunting, and the tables were also artistically draped with patriotic colours and small flags. The chair was occupied by Mr. R.G. Doig (president of the literary society), which body actually inaugurated the function.

The toast of "The King" was honoured enthusiastically, and the band played the National Anthem. The toast of "The Army and Navy" was proposed by Mr. R. Nicholls, who delivered a splendid speech enlarging on the deeds of valour displayed by Britishers on the field of battle, on the mighty deep, and also on the ice-bound regions of the poles. He also referred to the magnificent self-sacrifice of Captain Oates.

The toast was responded to by Councillor H.H. Coombe, who dwelt on the increased power the British Navy was wielding on the seas today by keeping commercial trade routes open and keeping the enemy's vessels inactive. "The Allies" was proposed by the chairman, who spoke of the splendid stand made by that plucky little country, Belgium. The response was made by Mr. A.R. Ferguson, in a manner quite suitable for the occasion.

"The Guests" was proposed by the mayor (Mr. J.J. Thomas.) He had known Sergeant Nicholls and Bugler Witcombe most of their lives and knew them to be just the type of men wanted in the force, and felt perfectly sure they would give a good account of themselves wherever they might be. "The

Expeditionary Forces" was submitted by the Rev. J.C. Richmond, who spoke of the duty Australia owed to the motherland and spoke of the members of the force as men equal to the task of sustaining the traditions of British pluck and bravery. The response was made by Mr. J. Durward, who is an Englishman, and said he felt proud of England's Australia and was sure that Britain's cause would be ably supported by the forces.

"The Red Cross" was proposed by Mr. H.L. Black, who stated that within a week the ladies of Port Wakefield had arranged and made up two large cases of necessaries for this department of a value of not less than £20, and above that had over £8 of cash still in hand. Mr. R. Monaghan responded and referred to the necessity of having everything well equipped in this branch of the force.

Patriotic songs were rendered during the evening by Messrs T.S. Thomas, H. Drake, and H.W. Rendell. "The Song of Australia" was sung by the gathering. The National Anthem concluded a very enjoyable evening.

ANZAC BISCUITS

INGREDIENTS 1 cup rolled oats 1 cup plain flour 1 cup sugar 3/4 cup coconut 125g butter 2 tbsp golden syrup ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda 1 tbsp boiling water



Preheat the oven to a low 150°C Mix the oats, sifted flour, sugar, and coconut. Combine the butter and golden syrup, stirring over gentle heat until melted.

Mix bicarb soda with boiling water, add to the melted butter mixture, then stir into dry ingredients.

Place teaspoons of dough on lightly greased oven trays with plenty of room for spreading.

Bake for 20 minutes. Loosen while still warm, then cool on trays.




