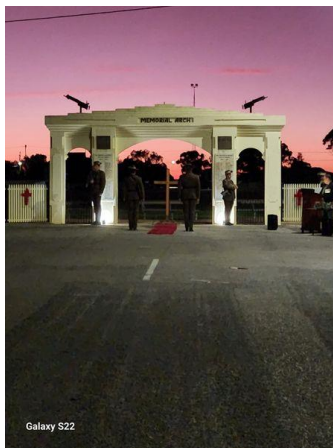
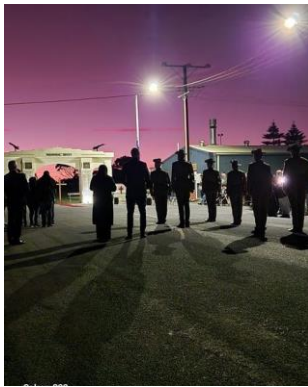

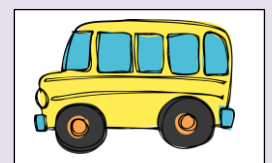

### Yesterday's News

May 11th- Our football team returned from Balaklava last Saturday night covered in glory and mud. Mr. J. Black, our goal umpire, on being interviewed by a press representative, declared that it was one of the best matches he had ever witnessed, and hoped to share much more glory with the Port team.

Practice is being indulged in on most evenings on the oval, but the players are somewhat hampered, as that piece of ground appears to be set apart for training coursing dogs upon, which leads at times to confusion. This evening for instance, the ball landed in a group of dogs, which startled them so much that one full-grown animal, in taking a backward leap, landed up amongst the limbs of a gum tree, from which he was with difficulty liberated ; and the fright so settled upon his nerves, that, as far as is known at present, he is running around the oval, in spite of desperate attempts to stop his insane flight.

After taking part in several weddings, which have recently taken place in this locality, we have once again settled down to everyday life, listening to the cheery news from amongst the farmers, who are now up to their necks in tilling, and it is expected that a large area will be under cultivation this year.

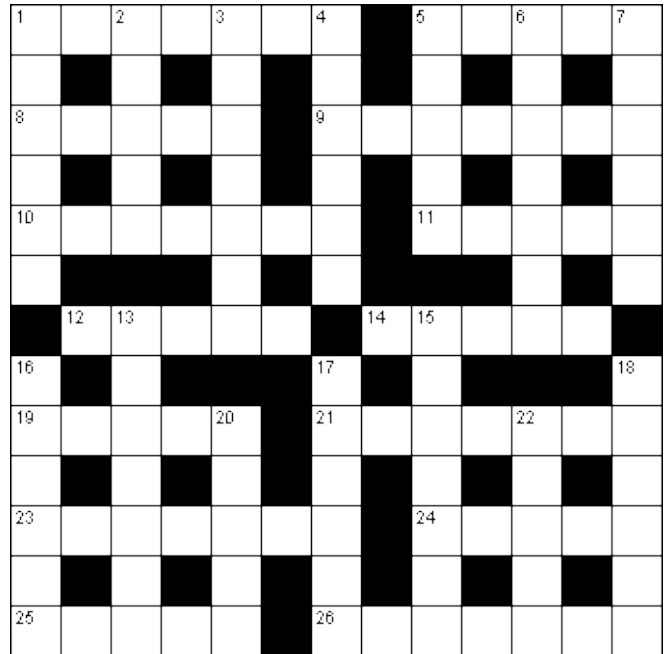

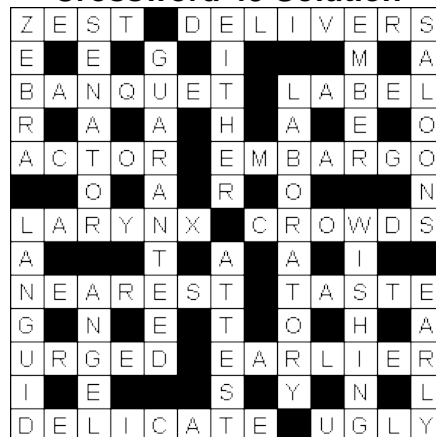
