

ROUND 6 ROUND UP



Yesterday's News

The Kadina and Wallaroo Times June 17, 1899.

Port Wakefield, June 16.

A gentleman yesterday morning while making the usual inspection of his poultry yard discovered four prize pigeons and a tame plover dead: the cause of their deaths being due to a small but curious looking animal about 15 inches long, the head resembling that of a fox with a very sharp pointed mouth. The body not unlike that of a rat being a dark grey while the tail was very busy at the end.

The birds each were marked where the animal had pierced them to the very heart with its sharp mouth. In endeavouring to capture the beast, a son of the gentleman, fearing it might escape and do damage in the neighbour's yard, destroyed it with a bar of iron. The body was on view at one of the principal warehouses all day, and was inspected by several experts, and received about a dozen names from a rock opossum to a weasel. It was, however, decided to send it to an expert in Adelaide to find out what it really was, the gentleman who suffered the loss taking it there himself this morning.

The weather is all that could be desired for growing purposes, but very cold at night and early morning.


A Public Access Automated External Defibrillator (AED) has now been installed at 24 Seven Port Wakefield (Liberty Service Station).

Cardiac arrest is one of the leading causes of death in Australia. However, early intervention with CPR and defibrillation can greatly improve survival rates. An AED is a device which is placed on a person who has had a cardiac arrest and works by delivering an electrical shock to the heart to help restore a normal rhythm. Use of an AED within the first three minutes of a cardiac arrest has shown to improve lifesaving outcomes of patients from 10% up to 70%. (*Thanks to Nicholas Karalis*).




