

LET'S GLOW!

3-Ingredient Laminate Floor Cleaner

Laminate floors are a blessing and a curse. Our house has laminates that take a beating thanks to two animals and two teenagers who are always hanging out near the food. The good news is that they don't show wear and tear quite like hardwood floors, even after all the scratches, scrapes and scuffs. But the bad news is that they're a beast to clean. Most of the floor cleaners I've tried leave a waxy film that's hard to get rid of, and the last thing you want is to clean your floors after cleaning your floors. That's where this homemade laminate floor cleaner.

It's cheap, easy to whip up and effective. Plus it's made with only 3 ingredients, so you never have to worry about running out. Vinegar and rubbing alcohol are king when it comes to homemade laminate floor wash. Vinegar helps disinfect and deodorise, and rubbing alcohol evaporates quickly without pooling or leaving streaks. While a water-based solution isn't ideal, a little bit of water extends the life of your cleaner and makes it gentle enough to use on your floors everyday. And a couple drops of orange essential oil gets rid of grease and helps mask the scent of vinegar and alcohol, which can be overpowering at first but should fade as the solution dries.

Before washing your floors, start by sweeping with a soft bristle broom to collect hair and dust. Then tackle dried spills and stains by blotting them with a microfiber towel. Next, wash your floors to get rid of lingering dirt and grime. Do yourself a favour and pick up one of those spray laminate floor mops that looks like a reusable Swiffer. After mopping, go over floors with a dry microfiber cloth or a dry mop to ensure no water remains on the laminate.

Ingredients:

- \cdot 1/2 cup white vinegar
- · 1/2 cup rubbing alcohol
- \cdot 1/2 cup filtered water
- \cdot 5 drops sweet orange essential oil

· glass spray bottle or laminate floor mop

1. Combine all ingredients in a bowl.

2. Transfer to a glass spray bottle or the solution reservoir in a laminate floor mop.

3. Lightly spray on floors and mop up, making sure no solution is left to pool in cracks. Use within one month.

Told you it was easy!!

Notes: Rubbing alcohol has a strong smell so open the windows and ventilate if you're doing a lot of cleaning. And don't use around heat or flames.

Some highlights from this round :


- Our footballers wore yellow arm bands to promote awareness around safe & responsible driving, as part of this weekend's Think! Road Safety round

Yesterday's News

The Central Advocate August 30th, 1907



PORT WAKEFIELD. August 27, 1907.

The usual quiet of the town was considerably enlivened by a party of Greek and other foreign fishermen who attempted to take charge of the Rising Sun Hotel. Not being satisfied with their own drinks they started drinking refreshers drawn for other customers, who naturally resented such proceedings which rose to fighting pitch. Messrs James Holland, E Fuetrell, and P. Buckley did yeoman service in keeping things in lawful hands, particularly the former gentlemen whose boxing knowledge stood him in his hour of need, and by a well-directed blow, laid out a Greek who had seized a billiard cue for destructive purposes.

Through being knocked against the billiard table Mr. Fuetrell received some nasty cuts on the face but was not long in retaliating. The enemy was gradually driven outside when by a well-directed blow from Mr Buckley a foreigner was lifted several feet in the air. The mingling of Foreign and British fighting language drew crowds of people to the spot as well as MC Jones, who had been on duty in another part of the town, and he, with the assistance of special constables Baker and Strawhan, quickly had the two ringleaders under arrest and in spite of strong resistance offered were soon in safe keeping.

Mr. Holland on being interviewed by a press representative) stated that during his 30 years, Saturday was the first time he had been relieved of his blankey shirt. The proceedings were adjourned from Saturday afternoon until 10 a m yesterday morning when Ostroman Giovenne and Gusippe Rano were brought before Mr. G. C. Hubble J.P., who after hearing of their exploits fined the former 10s. and 5s. costs but the latter gentleman having appeared in public before for riotous behaviour was awarded a fine of 25s. with 5s. costs, both fines were paid.
