


FRIENDS OF OSPREY

Friends of Osprey formed in 2022 to support a recovery strategy written by the National Parks & Wildlife Service, with community input. The group's aims include increasing the number of successful fledglings by installing elevated breeding platforms to minimise disturbance. We have also been tracking the movements of a limited number of birds once they leave the nest through colour banding and satellite tracking.

ABOUT THE BIRD

Osprey are a rare raptor which primarily feeds on fish & is found around coastal S.A (and occasionally inland water such as the River Murray). Due to increased coastal development and activity most remaining nests are located on offshore islands or rock stacks. There are thought to be less than fifty breeding pairs in S.A, a figure which has declined in recent decades. Sightings of birds from Friends of Osprey and members of the public help us to maintain a record of Osprey movements around the State. Friends are reminded to maintain a safe distance from the birds and to use long telephoto lenses (minimum 400mm) for photographs or to simply observe using binoculars or spotting scopes. It is particularly important that in the coming months as the nesting season progresses, birds are not flushed from nests by people getting too close. Predators such as gulls and corvids can predate on Osprey eggs in a matter of seconds when the adult Osprey is inadvertently flushed from its nest and distracted and forced to defend its nest against the intruders.



HOW TO REPORT A SIGHTING

Sightings can be reported via our Facebook page or by email at friendsofosprey@gmail.com.au Photographs are extremely helpful. When reporting a sighting we need to know the location (GPS if possible, date, time of day and particularly if the bird has a band

on its leg or is fitted with a tracker on its back

Yesterday's News

Kapunda Herald July 31st, 1903



A HORSE OVER THE WHARF

A somewhat peculiar accident occurred on the last trip of the ketch Otter, which brings coal for the loco department. The horse employed to haul up the baskets backed over the edge of the wharf and landed on one of the fishing boats, smashing the mast and some of the gear. As the master of the ketch disclaims all liability, the affair promises to end in the Local Court.

THIEVING.

The Port Wakefield and Maitland police were engaged in the reported cases of burglary at Price and Horsestealing at Clinton. The officers, after obtaining all information at Price, proceeded to Clinton, where M.C. Panton picked up the tracks of the pony and followed them for some miles, when he fell in with Detective Mitchell, and the tracks were followed out to the metal road, where they were lost; but further enquiries showed that the offender had taken the Adelaide road, passing through Two Wells the same day he left Clinton. The next day the Adelaide police recovered the pony, saddle and bridle, and on Friday Detective Mitchell arrested a young fellow, Jack Andrews.

On the 27th Andrews was brought back to Port Wakefield and sentenced to six months' imprisonment for stealing the saddle and bridle and committed for trial for horse stealing. There is suspicion that the same lad broke into the Price Hotel, but there does not seem to be sufficient evidence to warrant a charge being laid against him. The police are entitled to much credit for the way the tracks were followed for eighteen miles and the prompt arrest in Adelaide.


