To safely facilitate asphalt maintenance works in the Port Wakefield township, southbound and northbound carriageways of Port Wakefield Highway will be temporarily closed between Liberty Service Station and Ketch Road each night from Tuesday 2 April to Friday 12 April 2024, weather permitting. Working hours are 7pm to 7am, each night.

Once work is completed on the southbound carriageway of Port Wakefield Highway, the work zone will shift to the northbound carriageway.

Additionally, Balaklava Road will be closed at the intersection of Port Wakefield Highway. Traffic will be detoured via Shrike Road and Kallora Road, south of Port Wakefield.

Signage will be in place to alert motorists to the changed traffic conditions, and traffic controllers will be on site between 7am and 7pm.


The Mice Plague at Port Wakefield. TOTAL DEATHRATE 2,000,780.


The mice plague has now assumed most serious proportions, the total death-toll amongst them is now 2,000,780, and still they come. They are field mice, not the common house mouse, and the late rains have caused them to forsake the fields and overrun the house in countless numbers. Last night was the worst ever known. Many of the residents sat up all night to protect property from the invading hosts, and in one house 400 were destroyed. Anything meant for human consumption has to be encased in iron to withstand their fury. Cats are helpless, in fact, are sick of them. They swarm up trees, destroy vegetables, pollute tanks with-their vile carcasses, destroy wearing apparel. Nothing escapes their destructive methods. A bag of wheat, unless protected, is reduced to bran in no time. 
