

The Wooroora Producer April 6th, 1916

PORT WAKEFIELD -- A farewell social was tendered Privates F. J. McDonald, W. Spells, Prof. Johnson, R J. McDonald, W. Stevens, and R. McKellar. The Mayor (Mr. J. J. Thomas) presided over a large and patriotic gathering in the Foresters' Hall. The building was decorated with the Allied flags, and there was an excellent spread provided by the ladies. The proceedings opened with the National Anthem.

The following toasts were submitted:—" Our Boys at the Front," by Messrs. P. J. Doig and: E.G. Hubble; "The Parents and Relatives," by Messrs. H. L. Black and A. Johnson; "Boys Going to the Front," Messrs. E. H. Wickham and Sergeant Farrell; "Our Allies," Messrs. W. A. Hamdorf and Rev. J.C. Richmond; "Red Cross," Messrs. T. S. Thomas and L. Johnson. In submitting "Our Guests," the Chairman pointed out that over 120 had gone to Port Wakefield, and on Monday 12 recruits had gone down and nine had passed. Privates McDonald (2), Spells, Johnson, and Stevens responded. The soldiers were each presented with a belt. The toast of "The Ladies" was given by the Mayor and responded to by Councillor C.H. Graham. Musical and vocal items were given by Messrs. E.H. Wickham and A. E. Steiner. The Port Wakefield brass band rendered several selections. It was resolved that at future gatherings of this nature the ladies be invited. The proceedings closed with the National Anthem.

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
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
