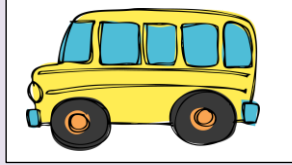

**LETTERS FROM THE FRONT.
FIVE AUSTRALIANS ACCOUNT FOR EIGHT TURKS.**

Mrs. W. Kennedy, Port Wakefield, has received a letter from her son, Private W. Kennedy, dated from the hospital at Heliopolis, May 15. He says: "I am not too well, but I hope to be all right in a week. We have been to the Dardanelles, and we have had a hard time lately. We landed under fire, and I was in the firing line 21+ hours before I got injured. I got hit with a piece of shrapnel in the thigh, but that is nothing. It is all right again now. You would not know that I had been hit to see it. But the worst was to come, I was taken back to the hospital over there and my wound was dressed. I then went up to the firing line, five of us together going up. About half-way to the trench we met eight Turks, and we had a little battle between us. Well, we accounted for them. I got three, and we lost one of our chaps. We got safely up and went in the trenches. I had been in the trenches about an hour and a half when a shrapnel shell burst on the top of our trench in the bank. The shock was terrible. Twenty-two of us got blinded with dust and powder, and were sent to the Heliopolis Hospital, where I have been for seventeen days. Nine out of the twenty-two are stone blind. Three have lost the sight of one eye. I went under two operations for my right eye. It is very bad, but the doctor says it will get all right again in time. I will not be any more good for war, and when we are all well again they are going to invalid us home to Australia. I felt sorry for that, but I think I have done my duty, and it is no disgrace to be sent back wounded and put out of action."

Get your project off the ground with Council's Community Grants

Council's Minor and Major Community Grants are open again for 2024/25, with Major grant categories able to benefit from up to \$25,000 in funding and \$2,000 for minor grants.

Each year these grants support community groups to achieve their desired projects in Wakefield activating their local spaces. Last year's grants funded \$100,000 in projects including master planning for Brinkworth's Oval, new fences for Hamley Bridge's netball and football facilities and new darts equipment for the Port Wakefield Social Darts Association.

To be eligible for funding, community groups must have projects that are aligned with Council's Wakefield 2030 plan, they must be investment ready and inclusive and accessible and the projects must be on community land. Community groups looking to apply for the funding must be based within the Wakefield region and the grants are subject to Council approving the 2024/25 budget.

Mayor Rodney Reid encouraged all community groups to take the time and consider the projects, they're looking to complete in the upcoming year. "This grant funding provides a way for our local community groups to accomplish great projects for their club or group, each year I look forward to seeing how the groups will use this funding," Mayor Reid said.

All of the grant application details can be found on Council's website at www.wrc.sa.gov.au Guidelines for applying to each funding category can also be found on Council's website and should be read carefully before applying.

Applications for the Community Grants program close Friday 31 May 2024 and applicants will be notified if their project has been successful in July 2024

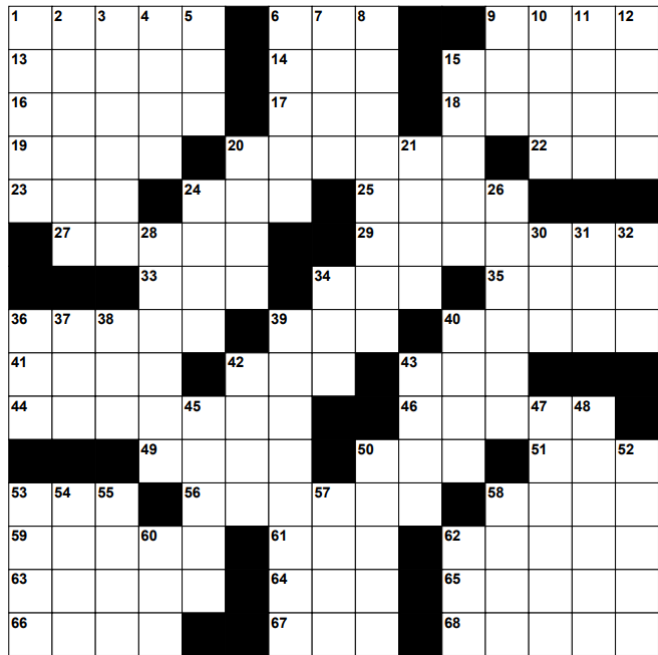
