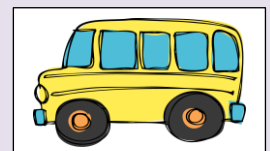

## Yesterday's News



*The Kadina and Wallaroo Times May 6th 1905*

Port Wakefield -- The prospects of a good season were never much brighter than at present. The fine weather following 3 inches of good, solid rain has allowed the farmers to push on rapidly with tilling, and they have no water carting to divert their attention. Feed is springing up in abundance and has seldom been seen to such perfection in early May, so that we may be cheerful and enjoy the good things provided.

We have been suddenly placed face to face with a bill of fare showing us a sudden rise in meat in all its branches, from one end of a sheep at 4 1/2d. per lb. up to the other end of a bullock at 6d per lb. However, no mention has been made of sausages and other smallgoods, doubtless owing to the difficult matter of fixing a price on the different parts of animals used in the manufacture of these articles.

To feed the hungry and assist in sparing the lives of sheep and oxen (which must be by now nearly worth their weight in silver), men and boys have been compelled to search the very bottom of the sea for fish and risking their lives in boats scarcely sea worthy. Others with guns and dogs have chased the ducks and hares for miles back into the wilderness. The bunny, who a short time back was sought after with poison, is now considered a dainty dish. Men have retired at sunset and risen with the moon, surrounded waterholes with their teeth chattering in search of wild fowl. The lagoon near the town is being well searched, in the hope of capturing stray ducks. The townfolk are early astir, sleep being out of the question through the rattle of musketry before dawn.
