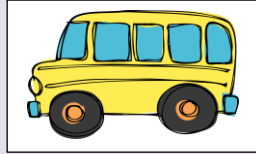

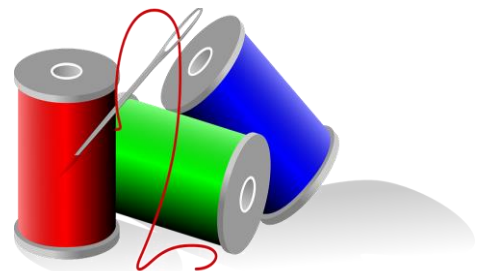

## **Port Wakefield forum to support concerned workers affected by shutdown**

WORKERS and suppliers affected by the impending closure of Seven Point Pork at Port Wakefield are encouraged to attend a community forum on July 2 to both access support services and map out their options to remain in the region.

The forum, to be held in the Port Wakefield Soldiers' Memorial Hall from 6pm, will be a significant information sharing event, where community members can advise relevant government services of their situation but also discuss possible employment pathways available. Representatives from support agencies including Workskill Australia, atWork Australia, Department of Human Services and Services Australia are also expected to attend.

Wakefield Regional Council is partnering with Regional Development Yorke and Mid North, PIRSA, Department of Employment and Workplace Relations, Department of State Development and Workforce Australia – Local Jobs to deliver the event.

WRC Mayor, Rodney Reid, said the forum is part of the regional response to the upcoming closure, which is aiming to both connect affected workers with new local opportunities but also inform key government agencies about the wider impact of the job losses in the community.

While the forum starts at 6pm and wraps up at 8pm, it will be open for people to attend and provide their feedback, ask questions or connect with services at any point throughout the evening.

Those unable to attend but wish to access the services, connections or just provide feedback and observations can do so via Wakefield Regional Council's contact channels.

I am pleased to report we raised more than last year with a total of \$546. We will continue to grow this fundraiser and see what we can achieve next year.

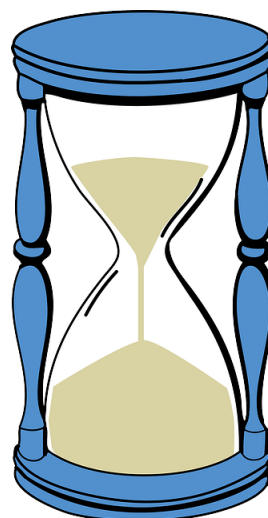


## Port Wakefield Time Capsule

## Yesterday's News

*The Areas' Express* July 21, 1883



Port Wakefield -- The splendid season we are having has put all classes in good spirits and increased business to a great extent though tradespeople do not expect to do much at this season. The crops everywhere for many miles round look splendid, and both farmers and others say things have not looked so promising for a good harvest for about seven or eight years. It is to be hoped that effects of this splendid season will not be spoilt by the appearance of red rust, takeall, black rust or hot winds

I would advise tradespeople and others to be on their guard against receiving counterfeit coins as they are frequently being passed. One (a spurious half-crown) having been passed recently at one of the local hotels. The coin is a very good imitation of a genuine one but lacks the brightness and smoothness and weight of the genuine coin, and when tried does not ring and is easily cut with a knife. It is in Mounted Constable Dowling's possession who has shown it all over the place, and requested people to assist him in detecting any person trying to pass similar counterfeits.

The much talked of Wills Creek or "Price" as the new township is called is beginning to go ahead and last week W. Moore & Co opened a branch store there, on the occasion of which several farmers and others were invited to the opening. After a hearty lunch, to which a great number sat down "success to Price" was drank, and after the usual toasts and speeches the large store was cleared and about sixteen couples tripped the light fantastic until an early hour the following morning.

Perhaps not the most enjoyable or enviable part of the fun happened to the party who left here about 5.30 a.m. in an open boat expecting to get there about 9 a.m. But when they got across the Gulf no one knew the exact entrance to the creek. They eventually determined to try their luck with the result that they got "stuck in the mud." Not dis-heartened at this they manfully went to work and pushed the boat along for nearly two miles, but finding that human endurance has a limit they gave it up and in desperation to reach the coveted goal they after removing certain parts of their toilets (which it is not necessary to name) started to walk through the mangroves and water ; but after with great difficulty getting about a mile and a half they came to a wide and deep creek running across their path and they were forced to return to the boat thoroughly exhausted, and with to one gentleman the loss of a very necessary portion of his attire.

The result was that after sitting in the boat a few hours the tide rose and they reached their destination about 3 p.m. not too fresh, nor too pleased with their experience in entering Wills' Creek by water for the first time.

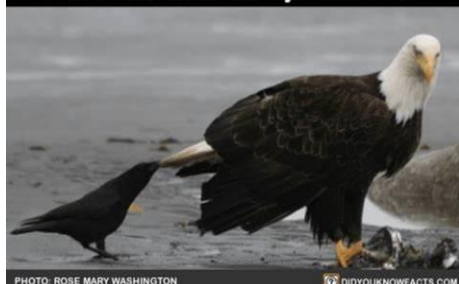
