Yesterday's News

The Central Advocate October 13th, 1905



On Saturday last the local cricketers suffered a disastrous defeat at the hands of the Balaklava team, The day was beautifully fine, and the same remark applies to some parts of the match. Most of our acrobats are in active training, and some fast and heavy work is expected on November 13.

To-day has been a small summer in itself; a strong north wind has been continually in force, and northwards large clouds of dust have been visible. Rain is anxiously looked for and would do an amount of good where the crops are out in ear. Preparations are being made for the coming harvest, and by all accounts two new wheat sheds are to be erected on the wharf, and when erected will be of great advantage in preserving the wheat from the weather.

Hay fever is prevalent at present, but so far no serious cases have been recorded. The snake season has opened, and promises to be a record one; nearly every day tales of a snake either seen, or nearly so, is reported; they lay about in every available place where good warm sunshine is to be had; they are in some instances shot, while others have been stoned to death. One came to an untimely end last week through being foolish enough to get in the path of a fast going motor bike, and when found had its back crashed to palp and wearing a strong smell of petrol. The reptile was over five feet long and bore strong evidence of having been slain while in rapid motion.


The Chronicle October 26th, 1912

The sandhills to the east of the town are covered with saltbush and are the favourite summer camping places for swagmen. This season, on account of the continued gales, the sand is shifting from one hill to another and nearly caused the burial of a couple of tramps on Saturday night. They had spread out their belongings and were asleep when a heavy wind arose. The camp was enveloped in dust, and after the storm an unbroken field of white sand was seen at midnight. A third swagman in search of a sheltered spot kicked against a boot. On investigating the mystery, he discovered the body of a man, who, after a liberal supply of hot tea, recovered sufficiently to start digging for his comrade, who was unearthed apparently none the worse for his couple of hours underground. A watch was kept until daylight, when the three made for a safer portion of the scrub.


